Some have asked where I'll be living, and for my new address. I'll live at the rectory at St. Rose of Lima in New Lexington:

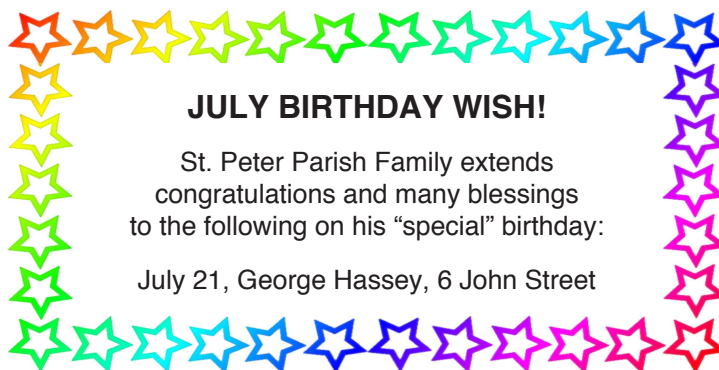

YOU can tutor elementary students in reading or math! Ohio Reading and Math Corps is seeking service-oriented people to provide literacy or math support to K-5 students who attend **Bishop Flaget School**. Members will work with students who are below proficient for their grade level. We provide training in September and ongoing support throughout the school year. Members are assigned to one school for the year (end of September through June). Members will provide literacy or math support to a group of students in small groups or in 1:1 settings. This is a great way to give to your parish school. This is a service position with AmeriCorps, requiring 30 hours/week September 1-June 30, following the school schedule (spring break/winter break off). Typical schedule is Monday-Friday, 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. High school diploma required. No maximum age limit. In return for service, Members receive a stipend of \$640.00 per month, plus an Education Award of \$2,950.00, upon completion of the term (June 30). This can be used to pay student loans or tuition. Presence to the Poor... Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy. Hope Clinic is also in need of various volunteers, especially nurses.

Feeding the Hungry – Donate items to the food pantry. Current needs are **canned fruit, corn, and peas, pasta meals in pull-top cans, pasta sauce, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, and SOUP.**

Clothing the Naked – When you donate items to Goodwill ask for a Donation receipt and bring it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society. They are given credit for each bag of clothing given, which can be used to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

Alms for the Poor – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter. Supporting the St. Vincent de Paul Society during its 5th Sunday Collections and using the monthly envelope. Support other local agencies such as the Assistance House, Love Inc., and the Good Samaritan Food Pantry with monetary donations.

Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

July 25: St. James the Greater, patron of Spain and pilgrims

St. James preached in Samaria, Judea and Spain. He was the first Apostle to be martyred in 44 A.D. His relics were transferred back to Compostela, Spain (legend has it, miraculously) where today stands the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela. The Camino de Santiago (or in English, the Way of St. James) is a network of pilgrimage routes to these relics. This 500 mile trek has become a popular pilgrimage for spiritual growth and a plenary indulgence can be earned.

RECIPE: Coquilles (calk-ee) St. Jacques (Shells of St. James)

(Serves 8-10)

Ingredients:

1 lb. sea scallops (fresh or frozen)	2 teaspoons lemon juice
1 cup dry white wine	4 tablespoons flour
1 small onion, sliced	1 cup half and half
1/2 bay leaf	1/3 cup grated Gruyere
6 sprigs parsley	(or Parmesean) cheese
1 can sliced mushrooms	1 tsp. salt; pepper to taste
6 tablespoons butter, divided	1 cup bread crumbs

Directions:

Defrost scallops, if frozen. Combine wine, onion, bay leaf, parsley and salt in a saucepan; bring to a boil; add scallops' simmer 8 minutes. Add mushrooms to pan. Add 2 tablespoons butter and the lemon juice; simmer just until butter melts. Drain contents of pan, **save** liquid, discard bay leaf. Slice scallops if desired. Measure saved liquid and add enough water to make 2 cups. Melt 2 more tablespoons butter in saucepan and blend in flour with a whisk. Add the saved liquid and half and half and cook and whisk over low heat until thickened and smooth. Stir in cheese and pepper. Stir in scallop and mushroom mixture and remove from heat. Pour into a shallow casserole dish or individual ramekins; sprinkle with bread crumbs and drizzle with last 2 tablespoons melted butter. Brown under broiler and serve. Not a seafood fan, substitute scallops with cooked small pasta shells; only add them after the sauce has thickened.
