YOU can tutor elementary students in reading or math! *Ohio Reading and Math Corps* is seeking service-oriented people to provide literacy or math support to K-5 students who attend **Bishop Flaget School**. Members will work with students who are below proficient for their grade level. We provide training in September and ongoing support throughout the school year. Members are assigned to one school for the year (end of September through June). Members will provide literacy or math support to a group of students in small groups or in 1:1 settings. This is a great way to give to your parish school. This is a service position with AmeriCorps, requiring 30 hours/week September 1-June 30, following the school schedule (spring break/winter break off). Typical schedule is Monday-Friday, 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. High school diploma required. No maximum age limit. In return for service, Members receive a stipend of \$640.00 per month, plus an Education Award of \$2,950.00 upon completion of the term (June 30). This can be used to pay student loans or tuition. 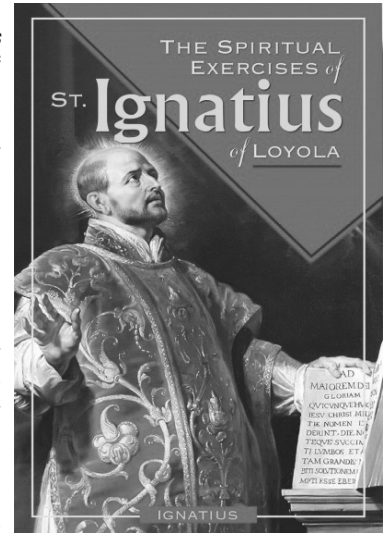

Presence to the Poor... Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy. Hope Clinic is also in need of various volunteers, especially Nurses.

Feeding the Hungry – Donate items to the Food Pantry. Current needs are **canned fruit, corn, and peas, pasta meals in pull-top cans, pasta sauce, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, and SOUP.**

Clothing the Naked – When you donate items to Goodwill, ask for a Donation receipt and bring it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society. They are given credit for each bag of clothing given, which can be used to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

Alms for the Poor – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter. Supporting the St. Vincent de Paul Society during its 5th Sunday Collections and using the monthly envelope. Support other local agencies such as the Assistance House, Love Inc., and the Good Samaritan Food Pantry with monetary donations.

Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

July 31: St. Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Jesuits (Society of Jesus)

St. Ignatius had a profound conversion after reading the lives of the saints while convalescing after a military injury. He turned from the world and turned to Christ. He is the founder of the Society of Jesus and the author of the “Spiritual Exercises,” which he wrote during a year-long, self-imposed time of prayer, penance and mortification. The aim of the Spiritual Exercises is discernment – of God’s Will for your life and between good and evil desires in your life. This four-week journey is a profitable way to get to know oneself and the Lord better. If you have never done so, consider making the Spiritual Exercises. St. Ignatius was from the Basque region of Spain, which is known for its simple and frugal yet delicious cuisine.

RECIPE: Sheepherder Red Beans (from catholiccuisine.com)

4 16 oz. cans red beans (or kidney beans) 3 strips of bacon, chopped
1 8 oz. can of tomato sauce 1 medium onion, chopped

Drain and rinse beans, set aside. In a large pot, fry bacon and onion; add beans and sauce and simmer for at least one hour. Serve with crusty bread and a lettuce and red onion salad for a simple Basque meal!

CRAFT: IHS (which means “Jesus” from the Greek transliteration) is often associated with the Jesuits. This craft from catholicinspired.com is perfect (and super simple) for this feast!

Red permanent marker was used to write IHS on white felt. Orange permanent marker was used to highlight rays on the yellow felt. You can use a similar design or create your own. Hang with a piece of string.

(high school +) *Saint Ignatius of Loyola*, by F.A. Forbes or *The Golden Thread*, by Louis de Wohl

Anima Christi ~ Traditional Ignatian Spirituality Prayer (This is an indulgenced prayer.)

Soul of Christ, sanctify me; Body of Christ, save me; Blood of Christ, inebriate me; Water from the side of Christ, wash me. Passion of Christ, strengthen me; O good Jesus, hear me; Within Thy wounds, hide me; Suffer me not to be separated from Thee. From the evil one, protect me; At the hour of my death, call me; and close to Thee bid me. That with Thy saints and angels I may be praising Thee forever and ever. Amen.
