Assumption

This coming Wednesday, August 15, is the Feast of the Assumption. On this day, we commemorate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, body and soul, into Heaven. The Lord saw it fit to never allow her body to know corruption, she whose body held Life itself, Jesus Christ, in her womb. It is debated within the Church whether she died and then immediately was assumed into Heaven or whether the Lord assumed her into Heaven at the end of her life rather than have her undergo corruption. There are saints on both sides of the debate, and it may be something we won't know the answer to until the next life. This is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have two opportunities here to fulfill our obligation and to honor Our Lady. We will have Mass Wednesday morning at 8:30 a.m. and again at 7:00 p.m. Either of these would fulfill our obligation.

Incense will be used at the 7:00 p.m. Mass.


Adoration Schedule for the Assumption on Wednesday, August 15:


Rosary for those affected by Addiction:

Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

August 15:

The Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady into Heaven, a Holy Day of Obligation.

This is a dogma of our Faith, that Mary was assumed into heaven, body and soul. This is a beautiful feast day in honor of Our Lady's perfect virtues during this month dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Traditionally, there was the ritual of the *Blessing of Fruits and Herbs* on this day and people would bring herbs and flowers to be blessed and to give thanks to God for His great bounty manifested in the abundant fruits of the earth.

It is fitting, then, to celebrate with a salad of fresh fruits (yes, a tomato is a fruit) and herbs. Your kitchen will smell delightful making this side salad. Serve with some rice and rosemary pork for a feast fit for the Queen of Heaven.

RECIPE: Assumpta Salad

(from the book *Twelve Months of Monastery Salads*)

Ingredients:

Salad

8 medium ripe tomatoes, sliced
1 red onion, finely chopped
1 cup pitted black olives, drained
1/3 cup chopped fresh basil
1/4 cup chopped fresh oregano
1/4 cup chopped fresh Italian parsley
1 cup cubed feta cheese

Vinaigrette

1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
5 tablespoons red wine vinegar
1 clove garlic, minced
salt and fresh ground pepper to taste

Directions:

Whisk vinaigrette until thickened. Let stand for 1 hour to steep garlic. For the salad, arrange the tomato slices on 6 to 8 salad plates. Sprinkle onion and olives among the tomatoes. Sprinkle herbs evenly, then add cheese cubes in the middle of each dish. Whisk vinaigrette just before serving and drizzle evenly. Serve immediately.

Finish with an easy blueberry-strawberry cobbler if desired:

Presence to the Poor... Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy. Hope Clinic is also in need of various volunteers, especially nurses.

Feeding the Hungry – Donate items to the food pantry. Current needs are **canned fruit, corn, and peas, pasta meals in pull-top cans, pasta sauce, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, and SOUP.**

Clothing the Naked – When you donate items to Goodwill, ask for a Donation receipt and bring it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society. They are given credit for each bag of clothing given, which can be used to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

Alms for the Poor – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter. Supporting the St. Vincent de Paul Society during its 5th Sunday Collections and using the monthly envelope. Support other local agencies, such as the Assistance House, Love Inc., and the Good Samaritan Food Pantry with monetary donations.
