



**From the Pastor’s Desk**

**Evangelization Booth:** A big thank-you to all who helped with the Evangelization Booth at the fair this year. As you may have seen from the many photos Chris Hiles posted on the parish Facebook – there was a lot of traffic at the booth. It is great to have so many people involved with being a witness to the Faith in this way.

**RCIA will now be on Sundays:** For those interested in becoming Catholic or learning more about the Catholic Faith, we will be beginning Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) classes on Sunday, September 9. This year, we are moving to a more convenient day and time: Sunday mornings between the two Masses. This is also open to those already Catholic who simply want a refresher. Consider inviting someone to learn more about the Faith this year.

**Dead Theologians Society:** Dr. Greg Thompson and I will once again be leading a chapter of the *Dead Theologians Society* here at St. Peter’s. This is for high school students, modeled on the *Dead Poets Society*. We gather in the catacombs (basement) of the Church, entering to the sound of Gregorian chant and the smell of incense. We read some of the writings of a saint and then have a discussion on how we can apply their wisdom to our own lives, particularly oriented towards youth. We will be meeting the first Thursday of every month, gathering in the Don Bosco room on the bottom floor of the parish center at 7:00 p.m., before proceeding to the catacombs. All High Schoolers are invited to join us.

**Exodus 90:** I am considering starting another Exodus 90 if there are interested men in our parish. Exodus is the program of asceticism, I’ve mentioned in the past, that helps lead people into freedom and greater clarity. This program was originally developed to help men who are fighting pornography addiction but has quickly become used for many other battles with our fallen nature (like anger, gluttony, excessive drinking, media addiction, etc). The impetus for this one would also include reparation. I think we, as men in particular – who are meant to be the protectors of the family, would do well to offer sacrifice in reparation for the recent failures in this area by a number of the fathers (bishops and pastors) of the Church. I would like this one also to be more closely in union with Our Lady, by beginning it the day after the Feast of Our Lady’s Nativity (Sept. 8) and concluding with Day 90 on the day before the Feast of the Immaculate Conception (Dec. 8). ### **Five First Saturdays Devotion**

Devotion in our lives should lead us to greater devotion to our Lord. Just as Mary told the servants at the wedding in Cana to “do whatever he tells you,” so too does she direct us to be attentive to her son when we seek her help. When we participate in these devotional practices, we do so with superstition that we will be miraculously granted some request. They assist us in deepening our devotion to our loving God, and desiring to model our lives more closely on Jesus.

The 5 First Saturdays devotion that Our Lady requested at Fatima in 1917 is like a religious formation program, according to the late Fr. Andrew Apostoli, CFR. This program consists in four actions that Mary requested over five consecutive months:

- 1) Go to Confession.** – This helps prevent us from growing cold towards our Lord in our hearts, and reminds us that sin really does offend God. Frequent confession, by grace, increases our desire and ability to avoid sin. Confessions will be heard after First Saturday Masses, but the confession can be fulfilled any time within 8 days of the Saturday. See bulletin for confession times.
- 2) Receive Holy Communion.** – This was to combat Jansenism which kept people from receiving Holy Communion due to the thought that we’re so corrupted that we’re not worthy to receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.
- 3) Recite 5 decades of the Rosary.** – In the home the mother often teaches the children how to pray. So, with the Rosary, Our Blessed Mother teaches us how to pray. This uses the prayer of the lips, vocal prayer. 5 decades is once around the Rosary.
- 4) Meditate for 15 minutes on various mysteries of the Rosary.** – This is in addition to the recitation of the Rosary. Here we attempt to enter into the heart-to-heart prayer, which truly deepens our personal relationship with Jesus and Mary. How do the mysteries speak to what is going on in your life?

**Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite.** Beginning in September, 5 First Saturday Masses will be offered according to the 1962 Missal of Pope St. John XXIII, commonly called the “Latin Mass” or the “Tridentine Mass.” This form of the Mass, virtually the same as the Roman Rite since the time of Pope St. Gregory the Great, was made more widely available to the Church by Pope Benedict XVI’s *Summorum Pontificum* of 2007. Offering the First Saturday Masses in this way puts us in touch with the traditions of our forebears in the faith and deepens our appreciation of the Mass in English. Translations will be available at the Masses.

### August 20: St. Bernard of Clairvaux, second founder of the Cistercians, patron of candlemakers and beekeepers

This beloved Abbot is celebrated as the second founder of the Cistercians, the Mellifluous Doctor, the apostle of the Crusades, the miracle-worker, the reconciler of kings, the leader of peoples and the councilor of popes! The beautiful **Memorare** is ascribed to him and he was known for his great devotion to Our Lady. He was born to a noble French family in the 11th century and many of his brothers and other noblemen followed him to the monastery. He was known for his eloquence in writing and preaching. St. Bernard was born near Dijon, the capital of the Burgundy region of France so we will celebrate with a recipe that includes this famous mustard.

**RECIPE:** St. Bernard Dijon Chicken (serves 6)

Ingredients 1/2 cup butter

- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 3/4 cup breadcrumbs
- 1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese
- 2-3 tablespoons parsley flakes
- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cut in strips

Directions

Heat oven to 375F. Melt butter in small saucepan with minced garlic. After garlic has sauteed, add mustard and mix. Let cool and whisk mixture to combine until creamy. Mix bread crumbs, parmesan cheese, and parsley in shallow bowl or pan. Dip chicken into butter- mustard mix, then dip in bread crumb mix to coat both sides. Place in a glass 9x13 baking dish. Bake uncovered 25-30 minutes, until juice of chicken runs clear.

Enjoy with a simple salad and a glass of Burgundy in honor of this illustrious saint!

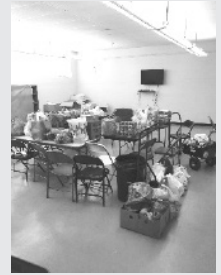

**Presence to the Poor...** Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy. Hope Clinic is also in need of various volunteers, especially nurses.

**Feeding the Hungry** – Donate items to the food pantry. Current needs are **canned fruit, corn, and peas, pasta meals in pull-top cans, pasta sauce, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, and SOUP.**

**Clothing the Naked** – When you donate items to Goodwill, ask for a Donation receipt and bring it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society. They are given credit for each bag of clothing given, which can be used to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

**Alms for the Poor** – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter. Supporting the St. Vincent de Paul Society during its 5th Sunday Collections and using the monthly envelope. Support other local agencies, such as the Assistance House, Love Inc., and the Good Samaritan Food Pantry with monetary donations.
