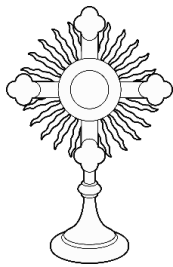

**Presence to the Poor...**Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy. Hope Clinic is also in need of various volunteers, especially nurses.

**Feeding the Hungry** – Donate items to the food pantry. Current needs are: **canned fruit, corn, peas, pasta meals in pull-top cans, pasta sauce, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, and SOUP.** Or help with the Thursday meals for the Homeless Shelter.

**Clothing the Naked** – When you donate items to Goodwill, ask for a Donation receipt and bring it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society. They are given credit for each bag of clothing given, which can be used to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

**Alms for the Poor** – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter. Supporting the St. Vincent de Paul Society during its 5th Sunday Collections and using the monthly envelope. Support other local agencies, such as the Assistance House, Love Inc., and the Good Samaritan Food Pantry with monetary donations.

### Living the Liturgical Year – Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

**October 22: St. John Paul II, patron saint of World Youth Day** – Karol Jozef Wojtyla was born in Wadowice, Poland in 1920. He was elected Pope in 1978 and his papacy lasted almost 28 years. He died on April 2, 2005 on the vigil of the feast of the Divine Mercy which he had instituted. Known for his zeal, his love of young people and his world travels to bring peace and the Gospel of Christ to all, Pope John Paul II was a great priest, pope and prophet of our times. In honor of this holy Pope's Polish roots, we decided to dish up some easy comfort food native to his country.

#### **RECIPE: Polish Meat and Potatoes (from [catholiccuisine.com](http://catholiccuisine.com))**

##### **Ingredients:**

1 tablespoon butter or olive oil	salt and fresh ground pepper to taste
1 clove garlic, minced	1 lb kielbasa, cut in rounds
4-5 cups cabbage leaves, chopped	3-4 green onions, chopped
Supplies to make mashed potatoes....	

**Directions:** Prepare potatoes for mashed potatoes and keep warm. In a large skillet over medium heat, heat butter or oil and add kielbasa and cook about 10 minutes. Add garlic and cook another minute, then add cabbage and green onions and stir frequently for the next 10 minutes or until cabbage is lightly sautéed. Salt and pepper to taste. "Smaczność!" ("Enjoy your meal" in Polish).
