Rite of Acceptance

This Sunday, we will be celebrating the Rite of Acceptance of Catechumens at the 8:00 Mass. We have one catechumen at this time, Michelle Corcoran. We also have one candidate (already baptized who is preparing to enter the Church), Audrey Glass. Audrey will go through the Rite of *Welcoming* at a Mass in January. The Rite of Acceptance is the first major gateway in the process for the unbaptized.

According to the Church's ritual book, those going through this rite are "assembling publicly for the first time to declare their intention to the Church and the Church in turn, carrying out its apostolic mission, accepts them as persons who intend to become its members" (RCIA 41)

So in effect the catechumen declares that they do hope and intend to eventually become Catholics, and the Church is affirming their desire and strengthening them. I know that you will join me in deepening our prayer for Michelle now that she will have taken this first step and Audrey who will be taking hers in January.

Music and Thanksgiving

In the calendar of the Church, St. Cecilia is commemorated on November 22. I bring this up, because St. Cecilia is the patroness of musicians, so this is always a good time to say thank you to all who help enhance our liturgies by sharing their talents: musical, vocal, and planning and organization. We at St. Peter's are very blessed in this. Our choir director and organist, our schola, choir and cantors, all are very gifted and share their gifts for the glory of God. They put in a lot of time and work to help ensure our liturgies are properly and beautifully celebrated. The next time you see one of them, thank them for adding to the beauty of our liturgies and helping us to glorify God by their hard work and sharing of their talents.

Also, a reminder that we will be having a Mass on St. Cecilia's feast day, as it is also Thanksgiving this year. The Thanksgiving Day Mass will be at 9:00a. The Mass is the perfect way to say "thanks" to God!

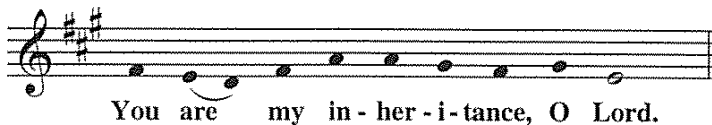

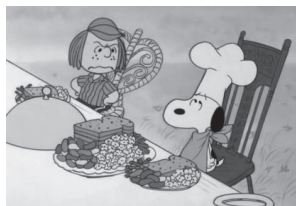
The Infant of Prague Adoration Chapel will close at 12:00 noon on Wednesday, November 21, and remain closed through Thanksgiving Day.

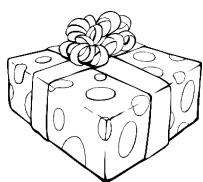

Trees will be up the weekend of November 24th and 25th! As we approach the Christmas gift-giving season, please consider taking a tag from the trees. Our congregation will again this year be providing gifts for many people in our community who may not otherwise receive a gift. We will have tags for area youth, nursing home residents, and veterans. There will be opportunities for you and your family to deliver gifts and visit with nursing home residents. Dates will be announced for delivery during the week of December 17-23. As the Christian Service Committee prepares the gifts for delivery, it is very important that all tags on the tree be returned attached to the gift you have purchased, and returned by December 9th. Please be very careful in your tag selection and be sure your family does not take more tags than can be returned. Each year, dozens of gifts are purchased last minute due to unreturned tags. Lastly, if you want to participate but cannot shop, please consider a monetary donation that can be dropped off or mailed in to the Parish Office. These gifts are invaluable as we always have last-minute needs for this service project.



Great News!!! We are working on filling a second bus!! We are blown away by the tremendous response of those wishing to travel with Fr. Hahn to the Holy Land in 2019. Deposits and Reservation Form must be turned in by December 15, 2018. After this time, any open spots will be advertised outside the consortium. Please make all checks out to NAWAS International. Check and paperwork should be sent to the attention

of Jenny French at St. Peter, 285 W. Water Street Chillicothe 45601. You can also drop these off at the office. Jenny is in the office, Monday, 1:00-4:00 p.m.; Tuesday-Thursday, 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.; Friday, 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon, and Sunday, 9:00-11:00 am. Please remember to check the date on your passport. It must expire six months AFTER the date of the Pilgrimage (November 15, 2019), so it should expire no earlier than April of 2020. If it expires between November 15, 2019 and April 1, 2020, you will need to renew it prior to the trip. Any renewal and purchase of new passport should be done as soon as possible. The travel agency will need a copy of the passport by the final payment date of July 28, 2019. <https://www.usps.com/international/passports.htm#first-time> is the site Fr. Hahn discussed at the meeting. You can also reach this link from the Holy Land Pilgrimage page on the St. Peter Parish website. All payments on the balance of the trip should also be made through Jenny French who will be copying everything as a checks and balance on the travel agency. Final payments on the trip will need to be made before July 28, 2019. Once a deposit, reservation form and passport copy are turned in, you will be given additional information regarding purchasing travel insurance and more detailed specifics on preparing for the trip provided by the travel agency. Hahn regarding pilgrimage preparation meetings.

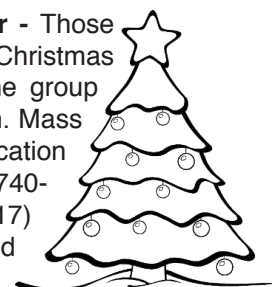


Christmas Project for the Homeless:

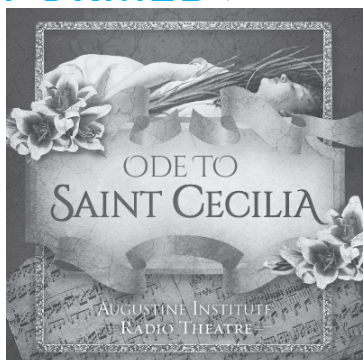
Feeding the Hungry – Donate items to the Food Pantry. Current needs are **canned fruit, corn, and peas, pasta meals in pull-top cans, pasta sauce, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, and SOUP**, or help with the Thursday meals for the Homeless Shelter.

Clothing the Naked – When you donate items to Goodwill ask for a Donation receipt and bring it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society. They are given credit for each bag of clothing given, which can be used to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

Alms for the Poor – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter. Supporting the St. Vincent de Paul Society during its 5th Sunday Collections and using the monthly envelope. Support other local agencies such as the Assistance House, Love Inc., and the Good Samaritan Food Pantry with monetary donations. You could also help feed, clothe and give alms by sponsoring an orphan at the Miryante Orphanage in Uganda.

Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

November 24: St. Colman of Cloyne, patron of Cloyne diocese, Ireland – St. Colman was the Royal Bard of Munster at the court of King Aodh Caomh. It is thought that he was influenced by St. Brendan to become a priest. His principal foundation was at Cloyne in east Cork, Ireland where the king of Munster gave him a site for a monastery and monastic school. He is reputed to have been the teacher of the famous Irish monk, St. Columba. He died in 606.



We thought it would be fun to try a slow cooker take on a traditional Irish food in honor of this wonderful Irish saint!

RECIPE: Slow Cooker Colcannon (from tastyeverafter.com) (serves 4-6)

2.5 lbs Yukon Gold potatoes 3 cups mix of chopped cabbage and kale
4-6 cups water 1 cup half and half
1/4 cup butter salt and pepper to taste

Peel potatoes and cut into quarters. Place in the bottom of a 4-6QT slow cooker and cover with the chopped cabbage/kale mix. Add enough water to just cover the vegetables. Cover and cook on low for 7 hours or until tender. Reduce slow cooker to warm, remove vegetables and discard liquid. Put vegetables back in cooker and lightly mash. Add half and half and butter and continue to mash until creamy. Add salt and pepper to taste. Serve with cooked bacon or Irish bangers for a real Irish treat!
