



### Pastor's Column

As we begin Advent, we remember that Advent is about preparing the way of the Lord. We look with expectation to His First Coming at Christmas and to His Second Coming at the end of time. John the Baptist tells us how to prepare for His Coming, "Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand."

We have the opportunity to do just that through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is offered here at St. Peter every Monday and Thursday, 5:00-5:15 p.m., and Saturday evening, 4:00-4:30 p.m. Also, there are a few seasonal opportunities coming up here and in the consortium:

St. Peter will host the Chillicothe joint-parish Advent Penance Service. At this, the Second Graders from St. Peter will also be making their First Confessions. It will take place Tuesday, December 11, at 7:00 p.m.

On Wednesday, December 12, there will be 5:30 p.m. Masses at Waverly and Zaleski, celebrating Our Lady of Guadalupe. These Masses will be followed by Adoration, with Confessions being heard (two confessors at each parish). In addition to St. Colman, Washington Court House regularly scheduled Confessions of Tuesday evenings, 5:00-5:15 p.m., and Saturday evenings, 4:00-4:30 p.m., there will also be a Parish Penance Service on Monday, December 17, at 7:00 p.m.

So make a plan now to come to one of the many opportunities to prepare for the Lord's coming this Christmas!


Finally, a reminder that we celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception Saturday. This is a *holyday of obligation* throughout the Church in the United States. There will be a vigil Mass here on Friday at 7:00 p.m. and a feast day Mass on Saturday, at 8:30 a.m. (The Saturday evening Mass will be the Sunday vigil and thus does not fulfill the obligation for the Feast Day.) There will be a Mass at St. Mary, Waverly, at 5:30 p.m. Friday. St. Colman will be the same times as St. Peter.

**Great News!!! There is still time to get your deposit and reservation form in for the 2019 Holy Land Pilgrimage.** We are blown away by the tremendous response of those wishing to travel with Fr. Hahn to the Holy Land in 2019. Deposits and Reservation Form must be turned in by December 15, 2018. After this time, any

open spots will be advertised outside the consortium. Please make all checks out to NAWAS International. Check and paperwork should be sent to the attention of Jenny French at St. Peter, 285 W. Water Street, Chillicothe, 45601. You can also drop these off at the office. Jenny is in the office Monday, 1:00-4:00 p.m.; Tuesday-Thursday, 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.; Friday, 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon; and Sunday, 9:00-11:00 a.m. Please remember to check the date on your passport. It must expire six months AFTER the date of the Pilgrimage (November 15, 2019), so it should expire no earlier than April of 2020. If it expires between November 15, 2019 and April 1, 2020, you will need to renew it prior to the trip. Any renewal and purchase of new passport should be done as soon as possible. The travel agency will need a copy of the passport by the final payment date of July 28, 2019. <https://www.usps.com/international/passports.htm#first-time> is the site Fr. Hahn discussed at the meeting. You can also reach this link from the Holy Land Pilgrimage page on the St. Peter Parish website. All payments on the balance of the trip should also be made through Jenny French who will be copying everything as a checks and balance on the travel agency. Final payments on the trip will need to be made before July 28, 2019. Once a deposit, reservation form and passport copy are turned in, you will be given additional information regarding purchasing travel insurance and more detailed specifics on preparing for the trip provided by the travel agency. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact Jenny at the Parish Office at 740-774-1407. If you have already turned in your deposit, watch for information to come from Fr. Hahn regarding pilgrimage preparation meetings.





There are many opportunities this Advent to be present to the poor in our community.


Consider one or more of these:

## Living the Liturgical Year

*Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes*

**December 6: St. Nicholas, Bishop and patron of bakers, boatmen and brewers and much more.** St. Nicholas is one of the most popular saints in the Western world though relatively little is actually known about him. He was born in Asia Minor (modern-day Turkey) and became bishop of Myrna in Lycia after the death of his Uncle, the archbishop. Many miracles and legends surround this saint of charity. We decided to make some St. Nicholas cocoa mix to try and to give away either for the Feast of St. Nicholas or even for Christmas!

**RECIPE:** St. Nicholas Cocoa Mix (from catholiccuisine.com)

8 cups powdered milk	1 (16 ounce) package instant cocoa
1 1/2 cups powdered sugar	2 1/2 cups powdered non-dairy creamer
4 cups miniature marshmallows	6-8 ounces finely crushed peppermint candy
5 quart jars with lids	red and white striped ribbon (optional)



Note: this recipe makes enough mix for 5 quart jars so reduce accordingly if you want less.

Combine powdered milk, cocoa, powdered sugar, creamer, marshmallows and peppermint candy; mix well. Store in airtight container or fill 5 glass quart jars and tie with ribbon and a tag with the following:

*For each serving, put 1/2 cup mix in an 8 oz. mug, fill with boiling water and mix well. Add a candy cane to stir if desired. Enjoy!!*
