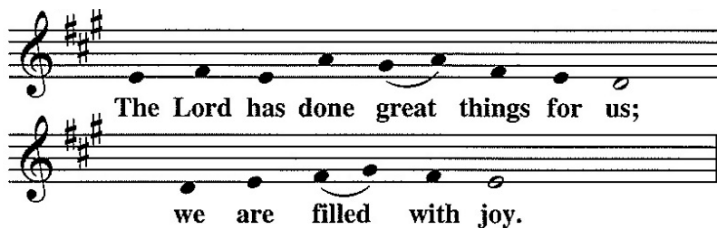

It must expire six months AFTER the date of the Pilgrimage (November 15, 2019), so it should expire no earlier than April of 2020. If it expires between November 15, 2019 and April 1, 2020, you will need to renew it prior to the trip. Any renewal and purchase of new passport should be done as soon as possible. The travel agency will need a copy of the passport by the final payment date of July 28, 2019. 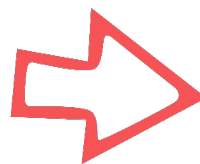
**Christmas Flower Memorial Fund Envelopes**

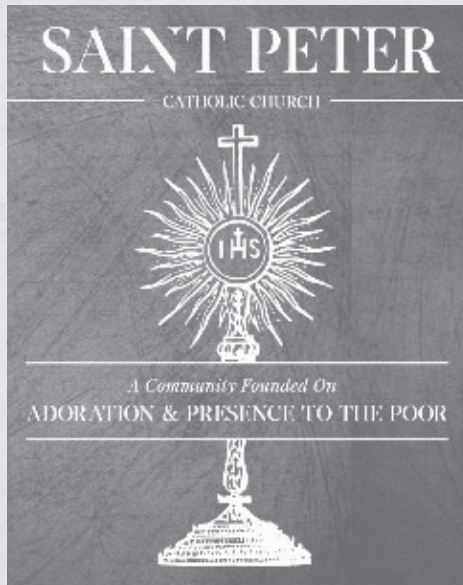

There are many opportunities this Advent to be present to the poor in our community.

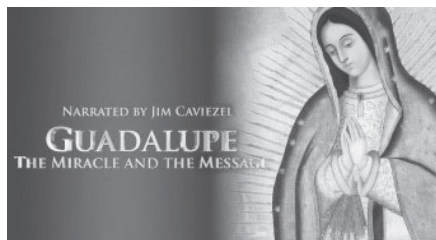
Consider one or more of these:

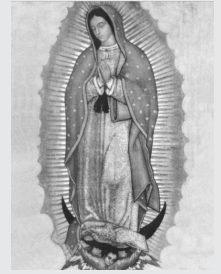

## Year of the Family

### Living the Liturgical Year

*Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes*

**December 12: Our Lady of Guadalupe, Empress of the Americas, Patroness of the Unborn** – Our Lady appeared to a poor Aztec Indian convert named Juan Diego (whose feast day is December 9) in 1531. He was on his way to Mass (a 5-mile trip on foot) when she appeared to him on Tepeyac Hill, just outside of Mexico City. She asked him to go to the Bishop of Mexico City and ask him to build a church on the hill. The Bishop was skeptical and asked for a sign. Mary gave Juan Diego roses in the middle of winter which he gathered in his tilma (an Indian cloak made of cactus fiber). When Juan let the roses fall from his tilma upon returning to the presence of the Bishop, there was a miraculous image of Our Lady imprinted on it. This tilma, which should have disintegrated after 20 years, now nearly 500 years old, can still be seen with the beautiful image of Our Lady as fresh as the day she left it, in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City! The Bishop had the church built on the hill and in a short period of time nearly 8 million people converted to Catholicism. We always celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe's feast day with a Mexican dish or two. This one is about as easy as it gets.

#### **RECIPE: 3 Ingredient Crockpot Chicken Tacos**

1 1/2 lbs boneless, skinless, chicken breasts, 1 packet taco seasoning, 1 (16 oz) jar salsa

Place chicken breasts in bottom of slow cooker sprayed with cooking spray. Sprinkle with taco seasoning and cover with salsa. Cook on low about six hours or on high for about four hours. Just before serving, shred chicken with two forks then stir to distribute salsa throughout. Serve immediately with soft or hard taco shells and desired toppings.
