


Pastor's Column

We also will have the normal Confession time on Thursday at 5:00 p.m. Finally, Saturday, we will offer Confession for an extended time from 3:00-4:30 p.m.

Also, congratulations to those who completed the Exodus 90 and Nineveh 90 programs of asceticism. Several groups formed to do this from the Birth of Mary (September 8) through the Immaculate Conception (December 8), as a form of reparation and for the purpose of seeking greater freedom and discipline in life. These two programs are ways of getting greater freedom and strength to live the life the Lord wants for us. The pillars are asceticism, community, and prayer. Happy Feast Day, Sr. Zephrina Mary!

Sr. Zephrina celebrates her feast day on Thursday, December 20th. Her religious name comes from Bl. Zepherin Namuncura (1886-1905). Blessed Zepherin was a native of Argentina and his father was a chief of Araucano Indians of the Argentine

Pampas. He was known for his holiness and devotion to the Blessed Mother. He died at the young age of eighteen and he was studying for the priesthood in the Salesian Order. He was made a Venerable by St. Paul VI in 1972.


How can you help?



Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

December 21: St. Peter Canisius, Priest and Doctor of the Church, Patron of Germany

Peter Canisius was born in Nijmegen, Holland in 1521 at the very time Luther had started to rebel against the Church. He joined the newly-founded Jesuit Order and was ordained a priest in 1546. He was sent to Germany and the first superior of the German province of Jesuits. From there, he began his remarkable work in the Counter-Reformation through his prodigious writings, powerful preaching and founding of dozens of colleges. It is primarily through his efforts that Central Europe was brought back to the True Faith. In honor of St. Peter's patronage of Germany, we decided to make this simple no-bake cookie that was a favorite of the famous Trapp Family (think *Sound of Music*) of Germanoccupied Austria.



Rum Balls	
1/2 pound vanilla wafers	1/2 cup light corn syrup
2 tsp cocoa powder	1/4 cup rum (or brandy)
1 cup pecans, finely chopped	Confectioner's sugar

Grind wafers very fine. Add nuts, cocoa, syrup and rum. Stir until well blended. Dust hands with confectioners' sugar and roll mixture into balls the size of a walnut.

Let stand for about an hour to dry partially. Then roll in confectioners' sugar. (from: *Around the Year with the Trapp Family*).
