Catholic Schools Week

This weekend, we kick off Catholic Schools Week in our diocese. We will be having a student speak at each Mass this weekend to that effect.

We are blessed here at St. Peter Parish to have a shared parish school. Bishop Flaget is supported by both parishes in order to make a Catholic education available to our children. In a Catholic school, the children are immersed in an environment where it is normal to talk about God, the Faith, morals and virtues, and a relationship with Jesus Christ and the saints.

Twice a week, class Masses are held and once each month, the whole school gathers together to worship. Most Friday mornings, whichever class has Mass also has the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The teachers are free to, and do regularly bring God and our Faith into the various classes they teach. The priests and sisters pay visits at various times. All of these are opportunities unique to Catholic schools.

I encourage you to take a look at Bishop Flaget if you have school-aged children. It's one more very important tool in helping our kids be formed in the Faith. Also, the school plans on hosting an appreciation breakfast for the parish after the Sunday Masses this weekend so please stop over.

Blessing of St. Blaise

Next Sunday, February 3, is the Feast of St. Blaise. There is an accompanying Blessing of Throats with this feast. At the end of the Masses next weekend, we will mark the Feast by providing the opportunity for you to come up and be prayed over with blessed candles. This is an ancient tradition in the church and stems from the fact that St. Blaise, a martyr for the faith, apparently had a gift for healing those who had throat problems. He was said to have saved a boy who was choking on a fishbone by praying over him. The blessing that is prayed as the candles are held over your throat is: "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every illness of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." Anyone is eligible to receive this blessing. There is no minimum age and you do not have to be Catholic to receive it.

Tuition Assistance

Also, next weekend I would like to take up our annual second collection to help provide tuition assistance for those in our Catholic School. This is also what the option is for on the monthly offertory envelope in which you can support tuition assistance or one or more of the other organizations that are listed. This is another way that we as a community can make sure that any St. Peter family wanting their child to have a Catholic education can be guaranteed that opportunity.

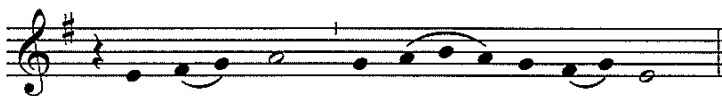

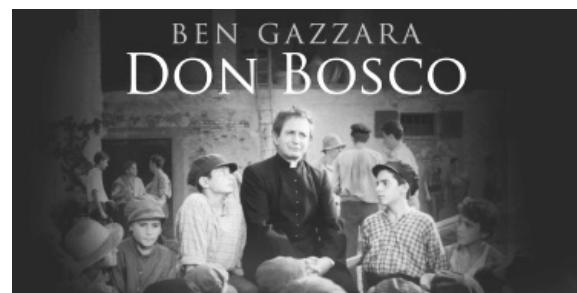

Year of the Family

Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

February 2: The Presentation of the Lord (or Candlemas)

February is the month dedicated to the Holy Family and so it is fitting that this month begin with this feast of the Holy Family at the temple. In accordance with the Mosaic law, Mary and Joseph presented the Infant Jesus to the Lord at the temple in Jerusalem 40 days after His birth. This feast is also known as Candlemas, and is considered a "Christmas feast" as it is the last one in the liturgical year celebrated for the Infant Jesus. It is traditional to have the blessing of candles on this day which harkens to Simeon's prophecy [in the Gospel reading for this feast (Luke 2:29-32)] "...a Light to reveal Thee to the nations..." We know Jesus is our Light and this feast reminds us to keep our hearts ready for Him so that we recognize Him as Simeon and Anna did, for scripture tells us "...suddenly there will come to the temple the Lord whom you seek" (Mal 3:1).



Crepes are the traditional dish for this feast and if you would like to try them, here is a good recipe: <http://catholiccuisine.blogspot.com/2009/02/candlemas-crepes.html>.

We thought we would try something friendlier to make ahead and very easy; this flaming dessert really reminds us of the Light of Christ!

RECIPE: Snowballs on Fire (from catholicculture.org)

sparklers or birthday candles (enough for each person to have 1)
ice cream
coconut, flaked preferred, but shredded will work
sherbert glasses or tumblers
chocolate sauce

Use scoops or balls of ice cream and roll them in the coconut. Then place the balls on a chilled baking sheet and put them in the freezer for at least an hour but they could be prepared ahead, frozen one hour then transferred to sealed containers in the freezer until ready to use. At serving time, cover the bottom of the glass about 1/2 inch deep with chocolate sauce. Place the coconut-crusted ice cream ball on top of the sauce and insert the sparkler (or birthday candle if you could not find sparklers at this time of year). Turn out the lights and bring in the dessert!
