



### From the Pastor's Desk

The diocese is excited for Bishop Brennan's installation as Bishop to take place soon. The Installation Mass will occur on the afternoon of Friday, March 29. It will be preceded the night before with Solemn Vespers at the Cathedral. Vespers is the Evening Prayer of the Church, involving the chanting of psalms, Scripture Reading, petitions, etc. Because of the limited seating in the Cathedral, these are ticketed events. The diocese has invited all priests, deacons, and religious of the diocese to the Vespers, along with two members of each parish to represent the parishes. They did something similar for the Mass. We decided to try to get a collection of people from the consortium representing different facets of life and ministry. All parish council presidents were invited. We then invited persons to represent pastoral outreach, ministry to the poor, young adults, liturgical involvement, mission work, Catholic Education, Eucharistic Adoration, youth and vocations, finance and grounds, etc. From St. Peter's, Greg Thompson (representing those involved with Eucharistic Adoration) and Thomas Noel (representing youth and those discerning vocations) will be attending the Evening Vespers Service on behalf of the parish. Eric Rinehart (parish council president) along with Sr. Ruhitha (also representing those involved in Catholic Education) will be representing the parish at the installation Mass. The priests and Deacon Hauser of course will also be attending, and the sisters were given tickets for the Vespers and two for the Mass so with the other two representing St. Peter and St. Mary, they too will all be there. Please keep both Bishop Campbell and Bishop Brennan in your prayers and Lenten sacrifices.

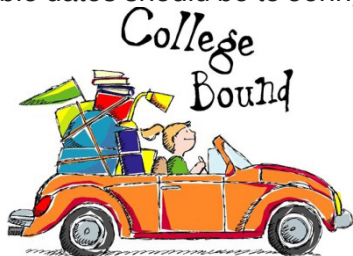

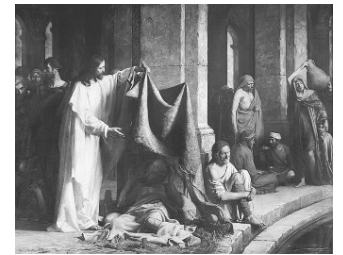

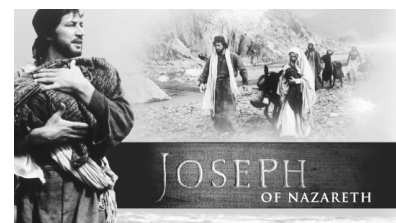

## YEAR OF THE FAMILY

### *Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes*

**Week of March 17-23, Second Week of Lent: St. Joseph** (March 19, Solemnity) – Husband of Mary, Foster Father of Jesus, Carpenter of Nazareth, and Protector of the Universal Church. St Joseph is mentioned very little in the New Testament and not a single word of his is recorded yet he is held in high esteem in many Christian denominations and venerated widely in the Catholic Church. His silence, humility and chastity are held up as a model for all, and as such is the perfect patron for numerous places, peoples and causes, particularly of families, fatherhood and husbands. Spend time this Lent honouring St. Joseph by invoking him under one of his many titles, consider praying the Litany of St. Joseph, read *Quamquam Pluries* (1889 Encyclical of Pope St. Leo XIII on St. Joseph), read *Redemptoris Custos* (Centenary Anniversary Encyclical of Pope St. John Paul II on St. Joseph – Guardian of the Redeemer), or pray one of the many prayers to St. Joseph that have been composed through the years and can be found online or in many prayer books.



**RECIPE: Pane di San Guseppe – St. Joseph’s Bread** (serves the whole family)

**Ingredients:**

3 cups unbleached all-purpose flour	2 T. butter	1 1/2 teaspoons active dry yeast
3 T. anise seeds	1 Tablespoon honey	1/3 c. golden raisins
2/3 cup hot water	1 T. cornmeal	1/2 teaspoon salt



**Directions:** In a large bowl, stir together 1 1/2 cups of the flour, yeast, honey, hot water, salt, butter and anise seeds. Mix into a smooth batter. Stir in the golden raisins, and beat for another 10 minutes, gradually adding flour until the dough pulls away from the sides of the bowl. Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured surface. Knead for another 8 to 10 minutes, until the dough is smooth and elastic. You may not need to use all of the flour. Place the dough into a lightly oiled bowl, and turn to coat. Cover with plastic wrap, and place in a warm place until doubled in size, about 1 hour. Grease a baking sheet and dust with cornmeal. Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured surface, and punch out all of the air. Roll into a long tight loaf, and place seam side down onto the prepared baking sheet. Use a sharp serrated knife to make 3 or four diagonal slashes on the top. Cover with a tea towel, and let rise until double in size, about 30 minutes. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Mist the loaf with water or vinegar before baking, and twice during. Bake for 35 to 40 minutes in the preheated oven, or until the crust is golden brown, and the loaf sounds hollow when tapped on the bottom.
