**Remembering St. Philip's School's early years,
part IV**

Enrollment during the 1964-65 school year was 462 (grades 1-8), the largest in St. Philip's history. An 8th grade had been added. On June 7, 1965, Monsignor Thomas Lyons was guest speaker as 49 graduated. Their graduation trip was on a school bus for a one-day sightseeing tour of New York City.

The Bernardine Sisters of Third Order of St. Francis were by then in their new convent (our current rectory), and made up most of the faculty. Early principals were Sister Celeste (1962-68), Sister Infanta (1968-69), and Sister Mary Anita (1969-1975).

In 1964, as the Second Vatican Council was winding down, our assistant pastor, Father James Scanlon, introduced the parish to the Mass in English at an altar facing the people.

This year St. Philip's School is celebrating its 60th anniversary. We hope former students will be a part of the celebration. Email stpaooffice@gmail.com.
