## FROM THE DESK OF FATHER LEWIS

Today, I would like to write about the exciting news that Pope Francis has named Archbishop Gregory to the College of Cardinals. Cardinal-designate Gregory will be among that small group of pastors who are specially relied upon by the Pope to carry out the universal mission of the Catholic Church.

What is a Cardinal? The word "cardinal" comes from the word "hinge." A hinge is important for holding things together. The Holy Spirit works through the Cardinals to hold together his Catholic Church. The Cardinals wear red as a sign of their willingness to die for Christ and his Church. (Fun fact: The bird "cardinal" gets its name because he has the color of the Cardinals – The human Cardinals don't get their name from the bird.)

Each Cardinal is entrusted with a "titular church," a church in the Diocese of Rome that he is connected with as its pastor. Of course, a local Roman priest handles the day-to-day parish operations on the ground. The day after the Consistory (the ceremony in which the Cardinal receives his "red hat"), there is a ceremony during which the Cardinal is installed as shepherd of his titular church. (As a seminarian, I had the opportunity to serve the Mass in which Cardinal Wuerl was installed as pastor of St. Peter-in-Chains.)

The most important responsibility of the Cardinals comes upon the death of the Pope. Following the Pope's death, the Cardinals gather in conclave to elect a new Pope. Typically, the new Pope (the Bishop of Rome) is chosen from among these men.

It is a great honor for the Archdiocese of Washington to have Archbishop Gregory named a Cardinal. It is also a point of pride for our local Church to be home to the first African American Cardinal. What a blessed, joyous occasion the Consistory will be!

**Remembering St. Philip's School's early years, part XV**

Carol Pica reported on HASA activities for the Parish Council in May 1986. She announced that a going-away reception would be held for our principal, Sister Virginette, who was transferring to High Park, Mass.

Sister Maureen was named the new principal. She served two years, 1986-88, followed by Lawrence Colabucci, a great principal who only stayed a year, 1988-1989.

In what had been the Faculty Room, Sister Annelle set up the first computer lab in the early 1980s. The students were probably learning on Apple computers. After Sister Annelle was transferred, Jeanette Zak took over the class and moved it to what had been the old kitchen.

By the way, Sister Annelle was our last Bernardine nun. Kathy Elborne became 5th grade teacher in 1988 and for a long time held the record of longest tenure. Also, in 1988, Richard Robinson came aboard as custodian, a much beloved presence at the school. When he wasn't working, he enjoyed sitting in the office, chatting with the school secretary, Nina Fisher.

The Art Enrichment Program during those years offered a better understanding of the field of art and its media. Mya Dyer was an early art teacher. Later, George Hunt, an accomplished artist, was instructor. I

n 1989, Brenda Cooley became our new principal.
