Remembering St. Philip's School's early years, part XVI

During the 1980s we had four associate pastors: Fr. Klaus Sirianni (1980-82), Fr. Michael Quill (1992-87), Fr. Joseph Sileo (1987-89), and Fr. Matthew Thompson (1989-1900). These associate pastors worked with the school in one way or another, and with the altarboys. (Altar girls didn't come along until 1994).

In May 23, 1982, Fr. Frank Desiderio, a graduate of St. Philip's School, celebrated his First Mass at St. Philip's. We honored him with a large reception.

In 1989, after the Bernardine Sisters left, the convent was remodeled to become the rectory. The old rectory, across the parking lot, was leased, but the basement served as the school kindergarten, 1989 to 1996.

In the fall of 1994, three St. Philip's graduates—Pam Murrell, Josh Lambert and Kevin Zak—painted a soccer-game mural in the hallway between the church and the school. Sad to say, several years later the mural was painted over.

On August 21, 1999, about 20 volunteers installed the children's playground. It was later fenced and has been well used.

In 2000 three Daughters of Saint Anne (Sisters Rezan, Tirhas and Ghennet) came from Eritrea, East Africa, to work with the Eritrean and Ethiopian community. The old rectory became their convent. Later their order purchased the home of the late Deacon Dante Ross and his family in Skyline and more Sisters came. In addition to their other work, the Sisters have served St. Philip's School as classroom aides and in after-care. They have also established a nursery school at the Ross home. (Deacon Dante and Pauline Ross must celebrate that, in Heaven.)
