**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

"Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So, do not be afraid..." Matthew 10:30-31a

There once was a woman who woke up one morning, looked in the mirror, and noticed she had only three hairs on her head. "Well," she said, "I think I'll braid my hair today." So, she did and she had a wonderful day.

The next day she woke up, looked in the mirror and saw that she had only two hairs on her head. "Hmmm," she said, "I think I'll part my hair down the middle today." So, she did and she had a grand day.

The next day she woke up, looked in the mirror and noticed that she had only one hair on her head. "Well," she said, "Today I'm going to wear my hair in a ponytail." So, she did and had a fun, fun day.

The next day she woke up, looked in the mirror and noticed that there wasn't a single hair on her head. "Yay!" she exclaimed, "I don't have to fix my hair today!"

Bald is beautiful, but that is beside the point today. As it relates to the Gospel for this weekend, this interesting story makes a faith statement for us to take into consideration. It gives us the understanding that if we trust in God, we will see the gain toward the good of eternal life in heaven rather than get caught up in the losses of what we know here below. What a great disposition to have if we are able to acknowledge and rejoice over the freedom gained, rather than the loss incurred. It is a positive spin on a negative experience.

Fear of a substantial loss of any sort often plays a dominate role in our lives as it did for the apostles, especially if we are in the mindset of, "What is in it for me?" The fear in the apostles' lives, as they have given up everything to follow him, could be related to the disturbing feelings in their hearts and minds of whether or not their commitment to Jesus was in vain and if their efforts in assisting him were of any value. Do we have those same fears in our lives as we are called to be disciples of Jesus?

Jesus offers us the assurance that we are precious in the eyes of God. If we remain committed to God, God will remain committed to us, and our reward will be great in heaven. Being counted among the blessed and being accountable to God seems to go hand in hand. So, if we maintain that sense of accountability to Jesus and acknowledge Jesus' rightful place in our lives, we can rest assured that we remain in God's good graces – hair loss or not.
