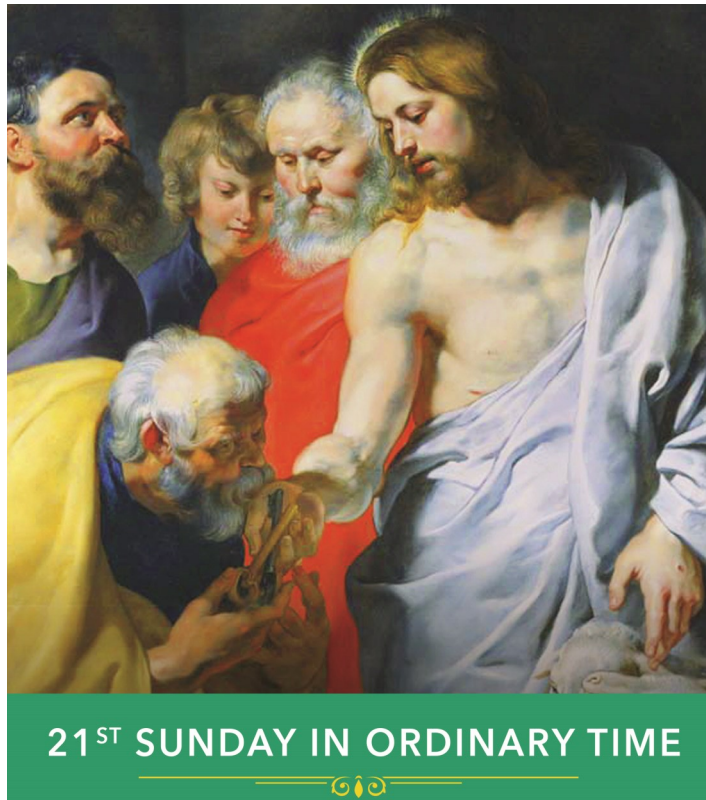

**DEAR PARISHIONERS,**

**Parish Festival:** Many thanks to all who took part in planning and/or participating in our virtual parish festival. By all accounts, it was a great success. We met our goal of over \$100,000! We are grateful to all who bid on auction items and those who offered cash donations. Your generosity is greatly appreciated.

We certainly do also appreciate the generous efforts that went in to the organization and execution of every aspect of the parish festival including but not limited to the promotional aspects of the event, the raffle, the silent auction, the Survivor video and the live stream show. We had many great volunteers too numerous to mention but we owe special thanks to the key leaders, Brian and Jill Powers and Mike and Jacki Noel.

We learned many new things as a result of this experience which have proven to be valuable enough to carry over to next year. As we plan to implement some of those new ideas, we have great hopes that we will return to the public gathering and community building aspect that we missed this year and continue to long for in the future. **A return to Class and a return to Mass:** It is customary that the parish festival takes place the week before school starts. The festival itself serves as a final event for many parishioners putting an end to summer fun followed shortly thereafter by a change in focus toward a return to learn. As the parish festival was impacted by the pandemic so it will be with the start of the school year. I am sure that with the excitement of coming back to the classroom there is a fair amount of anxiety as we continue to confront this pandemic. I would ask that we strive to be patient with each other as we navigate through these troubled waters.

Public safety should be a major concern for all of us. What it comes down to is a real keen sense of taking personal responsibility for your own sake and the sake of others. The approach that we have been using for returning to Mass is the same approach that is being utilized for returning to class. Wear a mask, keep your distance, greet with a wave, wash your hands, sneeze or cough in your elbow, stay home if you are sick and sanitize your surrounding areas. These are very easy things to do. We have been taking these actions in our church since the pandemic broke out.

Our Catholic faith champions efforts toward serving the common good and many of those efforts are based off of common sense. Please don't confuse the public health steps mentioned above with political agendas or as an affront to personal or religious freedom. As difficult as it sometimes can be, our focus needs to shift away from a total concern for "me" and be more attuned with and attentive to "we."

Even though the obligation to attend church is still suspended, I would hope that as our children return to class our parish families would then return to Holy Mass. Safety measures are already in place both in the church and the classroom. Just as our children need to attend school to learn and play so do all of our souls need to return to Mass to pray.

Please take the time and make the effort to come to Holy Mass.
