DEAR PARISHIONERS,

With the national election just a little over one month from now, there are lots of opinions on voting. Archbishop Jackels recently sent out some advice for us as pastors, and I wanted to pass it on to you.

The Church will not tell people who to vote for, but will remind them of the moral duty to vote, and to vote conscientiously, offering points for consideration on key issues.

According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops we priests are asked to refrain from any political engagement and abide by the expectations presented below:

1) Don't endorse any political party, or any candidate by name, or put up signs on parish property that endorse a political party or a candidate. It could jeopardize our tax-exempt status.

2) Don't state or imply that it's a sin to belong to one party or another, or to vote for one candidate or another. It isn't a sin to belong to either political party, or to vote for any one candidate, unless we do so because they're pro-abortion, pro-death penalty, pro-euthanasia, racist, or nasty to immigrants and the poor.

3) It's unlikely that any party platform or political candidate is perfectly suitable from a Catholic perspective. In such a case, we are allowed to make the morally regrettable choice of not voting in a particular race. Or, for grave reasons, we may vote for the candidate we think will do the most good or the least harm.

I hope this guidance from the bishops to us will help you as you inform your conscience in preparation for the exercise of your right to vote.
