Ambo: The Celtic Cross and the Four Gospel authors. Matthew = winged man or angel; Mark = winged lion; Luke = winged ox or bull; John = an eagle. (see Rev 4:6-9, Eze 1:5-10, Eze 10:14)

Altar: According to legend, in times of famine a mother pelican will wound her chest to start it bleeding so that her starving babies can be nourished by her blood. This was adopted an early Christian symbol of Jesus shedding His blood for us. St Thomas Aquinas referred to Jesus as The Good Pelican in the hymn "Adoro te devote" (6th verse).

Tabernacle: Designed to represent the Ark of the Covenant, and to remind us of how God works in history. The Old Testament prefigured what is fulfilled in the New Testament. The word tabernacle means "place of divine dwelling", "God tenting with us". Jesus is truly present - body, blood, soul and divinity in the Eucharist.

- X. Jesus clothes are taken away
- XI. Jesus is nailed to the cross
- XII. Jesus dies on the cross
- XIII. The body of Jesus is taken down from the cross
- XIV. Jesus is laid in the tomb
