Monsignor Frontiero was ordained to the priesthood in 1991 for the Diocese of Manchester (New Hampshire), and has served in various assignments throughout the last 28 years, including: Diocesan Vocation Director and Diocesan Master of Ceremonies (1994-1997), Diplomatic Attaché to the Holy See Mission to the United Nations in New York (1999-2002), and Official of the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace at the Vatican (2006-2011).

In 2000, then Pope John Paul II appointed him "Chaplain to His Holiness," with the title "Monsignor." In 2011, Pope Benedict XVI named Msgr. Frontiero a "Prelate of Honor of His Holiness." In 2016, Pope Francis appointed Monsignor Frontiero a Missionary of Mercy. Monsignor currently serves as Vice Rector and Director of Human Formation of Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD, where he also teaches courses in moral theology. He is a Fellow of the Institute for Human Ecology at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, and serves as an adjunct professor for the Master of Arts Degree Program at CUA in Human Rights. Monsignor Frontiero holds a Master of Divinity Degree and a Master of Arts Degree in Moral Theology from Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall University, NJ; a Licentiate in Moral Theology from the Catholic University of America, Washington; and a Doctorate in Moral Theology from the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas (the Angelicum), Rome.
