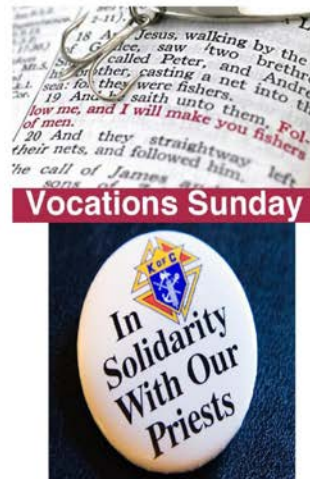
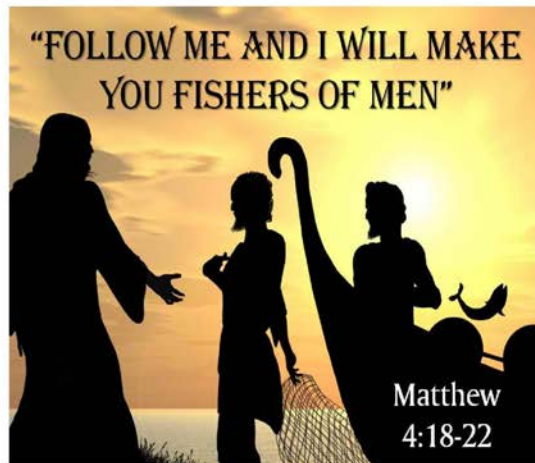
In support of our seminarians & religious

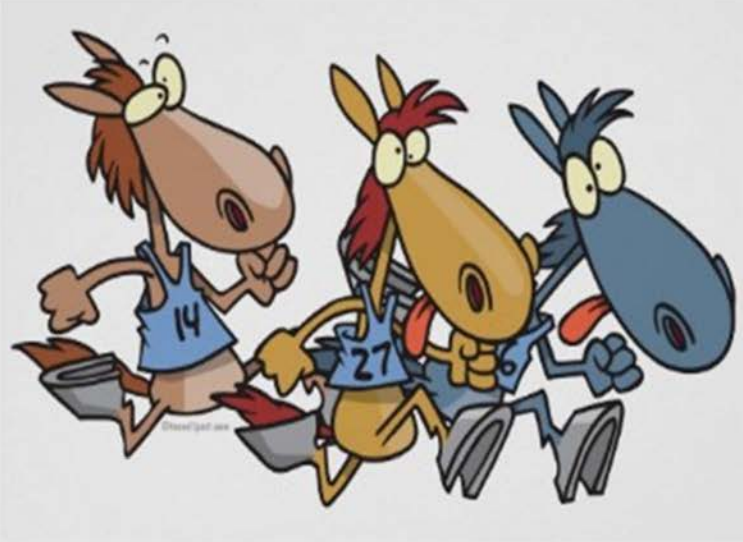
