I also know that most of this giving would come to an end if we did not have our weekly Saturday night bingo at St. Rose of Lima. We have over 300+ men in our council and only a handful of you are helping with your 4 hour a month commitment to bingo. I am asking that all of you please step up and help your council. We have quite a few young men in our council and only a couple of you work bingo. I know you young guys are busy, but we really need you to work one Saturday a month. Most of our bingo workers are senior citizens and it really is not fair to have them do the brunt of the work while our younger Knights reap the benefits. My challenge to you is this: If your ministry currently is receiving any funding from the Knights you need to come and work bingo. We currently are major sponsors of Youth Ministry, Religious Education, Hispanic Ministry, Respect Life, St. Rose School, St. Peter Claver Parish and St. Rose of Lima Parish. If you have come to us looking for money to help any of the above you need to help get your collective group to step up and work one Saturday a month at bingo. I cannot tell you what to do, but I am very strongly suggesting that, if you will be looking for funding in the next Columbian year we will be looking at the bingo worker list to see if your name is on it. ## Life Changing Accident — Eighth Anniversary

Eight years ago on May 30<sup>th</sup> I had a life-changing accident that I have learned to appreciate very supportive people during my road to recovery. Memorial weekend of 2009 I participated in a fundraiser for AIDS and HIV positive victims called AIDS Life-Cycle a 575 mile bicycle ride beginning at Cow-Palace in San Francisco and ending at VA hospital in Las Angeles.

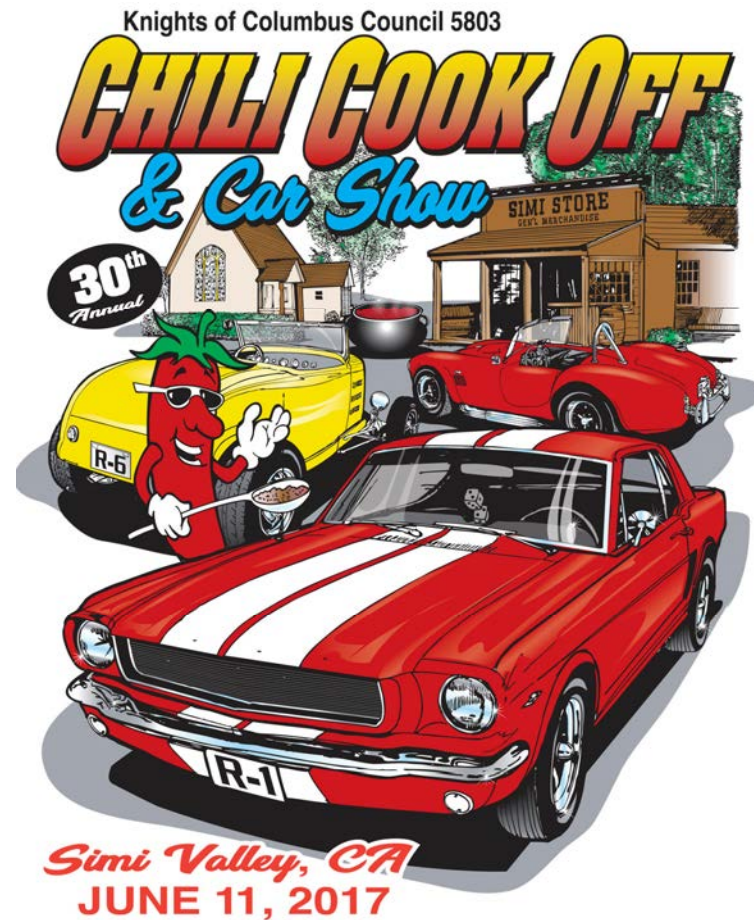
I entered the fund raiser to support my brother who has HIV positive and was one of the top fund-raisers out of over 2,000 entered. I collected \$8,500.00. Not bad for my first time riding in this event. After travelling only 13 miles I hit a storm train and went head over heels laying on side of street in a coma. My family was cautioned I may not come out of the Coma. Fortunately riding in my group was a EMT from the Santa Cruz fire department who came to my aid and got me to San Francisco Hospital. After 15 days in a Coma I woke up.

I was diagnosed with a brain injury and told to be prepared for several months of rehabilitation to regain my voice and balance. All my motor skills were impaired and needed lots of work to get back to normal. I really wanted to get back to work so I was assigned a Department of Rehabilitation consoler to help me find work. After several months of meeting and testing it was determined that I am not capable to enter work-force. This news broke my heart. After a couple of years my DOR rep Janice Baltrush informed me that there was a Brain Injury support group called Life After Brain Injury AKA LABI run by Cherrie Phoenix that possibly could help in your recovery. It was good seeing that I wasn't alone going through these struggles of recovering. Cherie attended court in Santa Barbara with me and my wife as we were trying to obtain State Disability Insurance to help with my living expenses. The financial depreciation was very tough to deal with during my rehabilitation.

All the Survivors along with Cherie were considered my family as I work to find a better life. Today, May 30<sup>th</sup> exactly eight years since I began my life of recovery. All Survivors learned to refer to this as their 2<sup>nd</sup> birthday. I need to thank my wife Darlene though she never wants to be reminded of my accident, Cherrie Phoenix, the Knights of Columbus, and several family members and friends who have contribute to LABI. I do owe the Knights of Columbus so much for all their support. I am very thankful. Today eight years later I am doing great and really appreciate all the help I have received.
