## *Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time*

*Isaiah 35:4-7a; James 2:1-5; Mark 7:31-37*

The healing miracles Jesus worked—the blind given sight, the lame are enabled to walk, the deaf can now hear—are important in their own right. It seems pretty certain that Jesus truly healed a number of individuals of certain maladies. He did this without fanfare of any sort. Indeed, as Mark notes today, Jesus took the deaf-mute away from the crowd to work with him. The healing miracles were in no way intended to bring attention to himself. They were works of compassion and mercy.

Of course there was no way to keep a healed person quiet. That person went back to his/her family, the neighborhood, the town as a new person. Word traveled quickly—so more and more of the sick were brought to Jesus for healing.

This became a major dilemma for the Lord: he did not want to be perceived as a mere wonder worker. The healing he wanted to bring to people was much more than healing of physical illnesses. And so in the gospel narratives some miracles became symbols or parables of this deeper healing. The healing of the deaf-mute is intended by Mark to be a pointer to that deeper reality—this man is, as it were, a sign of one who can truly hear the word Jesus is bringing from God, and then can himself proclaim it fully and clearly. The man “stands for” the apostles and others of deep faith who, as we’ll see the next several weeks, hear the word of God, understand it, and proclaim it boldly and freely to any who will listen.

## NOTRE DAME PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES – August 26, 2021

The August 26, 2021 meeting of the Notre Dame Pastoral Council was called to order by Jim Truka. Fr. Jacob led the group in prayer and the group joined in reciting the Parish Mission Statement. Present were: Fr. Jacob Rouse, Jim Truka, Tom Kleve, Keith Wherry, Patti Guyer, Brian McConnell, Holly Manske, Joye Meyer, Mary Larson and Joe Wacha. Absent: Maryln Shores.

The minutes of the May 27, 2021 meeting were reviewed. Mary Larson made a motion to waive the reading of the minutes and approve as presented, seconded by Joye Meyer. Motion approved by consensus. The agenda was reviewed. Brian McConnell made a motion to accept the agenda as presented, seconded by Patti Guyer. Motion approved by consensus.

Joe Wacha reported on the Liturgy Committee meetings held on June 3 and Aug. 5. Advent, Christmas and Holy Week were reviewed. Checking into purchasing good quality silk flowers and greens to use in church as live plants do not live long in the church due to lack of natural light. Also looking into purchasing a red front altar banner. Checking into different candles to set by the ambo. Cornerstone (Faith Formation) Program will begin in October. Running the Race – Bible Reading Program continues through September. Totus Tuus went very well. Ministry training sessions went well. All ministries are back at masses. Continue to need more piano players. Funeral choir is singing at funerals and Good News Singers will begin singing in September.

Tom Kleve reported on the Social Justice Committee meeting held on June 1. Discussed food pantry donations. Nursing home and home visits are resuming. Notre Dame delivered Meals on Wheels in July. Discussed Respect Life activities for October. Mary Larson will present information on Compassion International in October.

Joye Meyer reported on the August 16 Circles of Faith meeting. The fabric curtain inside the tabernacle has been replaced by Mary Wemark. Cleaning of the outside of the tabernacle is being checked into. Funeral dinners have resumed being held in the church hall. Fair Day will be held on Sat., Sept. 11. Research is being done on better lighting for the pianists. A question was raised by the pastoral council as to better lighting by the ambo as well.

Mary Larson reported on the August 12 Faith Formation Commission meeting. New members were welcomed. The school report noted Moo Mobile profit from the Fair for the school this year was \$1,505. Notre Dame School Staff attended workshops and in-services. A report was given on a successful Totus Tuus. Running the Race Marathon is underway and continues through September. To date we have accumulated about 500 of the 4,926 miles. Cornerstone (Faith Formation) Program will utilize both the church and the school this year. Back to School pencils were available for students. Adult summer events also included a Bible Study and Moving with Mission potluck. Catechetical Sunday will be held on Sept. 18-19. Mary Larson will serve as Faith Formation Commission Chairperson; Michelle Midthus as Vice-chair; and Tracy Herold as secretary for the 21-22 year.

Holly Manske reported on the Catholic School Board meetings held on June 9 and Aug. 11. Election of officers was held with Erin Powers-Daley elected Chair; Holly Manske elected Vice-chair; and Katie Holzer elected Secretary. Committee appointments were made. Buildings and Grounds and Legislative items were discussed. Katie Schmitt reported on the test scores, tuition payment update, staffing and enrollment. Registration was held in August. Salaries and bonuses were discussed. A shade canopy has been installed for the outdoor classroom. Preparations are being made for the 50<sup>th</sup> Fair Day on September 11. SCRIP was discussed.

The next Stewardship Committee meeting will be held Sept. 20.

The Council reviewed the minutes from the Finance Council June 8 and Aug. 10 meetings. Election of officers was held. Tom Barnes will continue as Chair; Maryln Shores was elected Vice-chair and pastoral council representative. The maintenance staff have been painting and cleaning getting ready for the school year. Notre Dame school staffing was discussed. Fair Stand net profit for 2021 was \$20,187. Financial reports were reviewed. The year end report was reviewed. Due to a generous bequest and the second PPP loan forgiven, the finances look good. A portion of the bequest was invested in CFAD (Catholic Foundation Archdiocese of Dubuque) with the balance used for maintenance and liability expenses. Bequests/donations to the parish and school are always welcome and appreciated.

Buildings and Grounds Committee will meet on September 1. Members of this committee helped install the shade canopy on the outdoor classroom.

Emergency Management Committee (EMC) – No report.

Fr. Jacob reported it was great to have the school students at the first school mass.

Conflict of Interest Policy forms were signed by the Council.

The parish has been contacted by Universal Church Directory Company regarding doing a pictorial directory. The last directory was done in 2016. The Council agreed by consensus that we should check into this further and try to set up a date in 2022.

Keith Wherry made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Tom Kleve. Motion approved by consensus.
