NOTRE DAME PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES – September 23, 2021

The September 23, 2021 meeting of the Notre Dame Pastoral Council was called to order by Jim Truka. The group joined in prayer and in reciting the Parish Mission Statement. Present were: Jim Truka, Maryln Shores, Tom Kleve, Keith Wherry, Patti Guyer, Brian McConnell, Joye Meyer, Mary Larson and Joe Wacha. Absent: Fr. Jacob Rouse and Holly Manske.

The minutes of the August 26, 2021 meeting were reviewed. Tom Kleve made a motion to waive the reading of the minutes and approve as presented, seconded by Keith Wherry. Motion approved by consensus. The agenda was reviewed. Maryln Shores made a motion to accept the agenda as presented, seconded by Patti Guyer. Motion approved by consensus.

The parish will be doing a Pictorial Directory next summer with photography dates set in July and August by Universal Church Directory Company.

The next Liturgy Committee meeting is Oct. 7.

The next Social Justice Committee meeting is Oct. 5.

The next Circles of Faith meeting is Oct. 18.

Mary Larson reported on the Sept. 16 Faith Formation Commission meeting. She gave updates on the "Running the Race" Bible Marathon which will end on Sept. 30; Cornerstone Religious Education which will begin on Oct. 6. The program is still in need of catechists and aides. The "Wee Families" and Marriage Enrichment programs were discussed. Catechetical Sunday and Cornerstone Parent meeting was held. Bible Study will begin in November. "Moving with Mission" has started two new faith sharing groups. "Word Among Us" will be available for Advent and Lent. The Christmas book give away will be "Life is Messy" by Matthew Kelly. October is Respect Life Month. Mary Larson will be giving a presentation on Compassion International on the weekend of Oct. 16-17.

The Council reviewed the Catholic School Board minutes from the Sept. 8 meeting. The financial report was reviewed. Every family at the school has either paid their tuition or is on a payment plan with 23 families using ACH to pay their tuition monthly. 58 students received STO and 32 students received Kucera Funds to help with tuition. There are 159 students attending Notre Dame School. All hot lunches and breakfasts are free again this year. Custodial needs were discussed. Phil's wife made a rosary located outside of the school. Fair Day plans were reported. SCRIP program was discussed. A report was given on Kids Club staffing. Curriculum and the Comprehensive School Improvement Plan were reviewed. Fr. Jacob reported he is teaching Religion to the 4th grade class.

Patti Guyer reported on the Stewardship Committee meeting held on Sept. 20. Report was given on Faith Formation including information on Cornerstone registration and staffing; Reading Marathon, Christmas book give away; "Word Among Us" booklets and Adult Faith Formation programs. \$200 has been donated to the food pantry from the Table of Plenty. The recent Reverse Collection donations have been exceptional. The timeline for the October Stewardship Renewal program was discussed. A report was given on the Don Davis Good Samaritan Fund.

The Council reviewed the Financial Report. The income and expenses are on target with the budget.

Buildings and Grounds Committee met on September 1. Jeremy Walker has been hired as a full time custodian with Phil Walker. Part-time custodians are still needed. Phil is contacting a company for advice on how to rid the church of bats which have been getting in recently. A mural will be painted on the back wall of the area where the outdoor rosary is located. Estimates are being obtained to replace several more spots of the cement in the parking lot. The new East doors of the church should be installed soon. The confessional window privacy film is being checked into. It was noted the north wooden doors of the church have been painted.

Emergency Management Committee (EMC) – No report. The Council discussed if it would be necessary to hold fire/tornado drills. It was also discussed the need to inform the ushers of guidelines to use in case of any emergency.

Mary Larson made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Joye Meyer. Motion approved by consensus.

The next meeting will be held on October 28, 2022.
