PHASE TWO UPDATE IN PERSON STUDENTS:

As you know, 3rd graders re-entered school on Monday 11/9 and the transition is going well.

We have a tentative date for 5th grade students to re-enter on 12/7. This is a change from 11/30, to allow for proper re-entry of K-4th grade students after the Thanksgiving break.

6th-8th grade students will remain virtual until further notice.

Governors Address:

On 11/10 at 6:00 p.m. the Governor addressed the State of Wisconsin and advised those who could stay home, to do so. Our school follows our current approved Safety Plan, which allows us to be in school during this time. Please note, that until the Governor mandates a closure and/or passes legislation, we will continue to remain open. This is an ongoing situation that is out of our control and we are committed to providing instruction to our virtual and in person students, to the best of our ability, all while abiding by our approved safety plan.

Thanksgiving:

Our ability to safely instruct in person students is only successful if parents are honest and truthful with us at the school level. If you are planning on seeing extended family for Thanksgiving, your in person child is to quarantine for 10 days afterwards. Regardless of

if they stay in town or not. Please note, that out of state travel will require a ten-day quarantine regardless. That means they will not be able to return to in person instruction until 12/7. Please know that we will survey all students who return to school on 11/30 and inquire about Thanksgiving. If at any point they mention they were with aunts, cousins, grandma/grandpa etc. who live outside of their home, follow up will occur with the parent/guardian to further survey accuracy and establish facts. If a decision is reached that a family did not abide by our expectations, I as the principal reserve the right to return that student to virtual instruction until 12/7.

Drop off in the Morning:

Parents, in order to help our process, run smoothly in the morning, please make sure your child is masked already upon arrival. It would also be helpful if your child is sitting in the backseat, behind the driver's side, as that is where we are positioned to take temperatures. In addition, please patiently wait in the car line. **DO NOT** form another line, or park in another area, that causes us to double back in order to temp. all students as quickly as possible.

In Person Students:

Please remember that all students need to wear a clean, mask daily. Students should also come to school with their individual labeled water bottles. Please continue to talk with your child(ren) about the importance of hand washing, distancing, and wearing masks.

Virtual Students:

All virtual students receive LIVE daily lessons in Reading/Math/Social Studies/ Science. Students will then receive assigned activities in each core subject as well. The school day begins at 8:00 a.m. for our virtual students. All teachers will communicate a synchronized schedule regarding when your child(ren) will receive live lessons and when they will receive assigned items to complete on their own. K-2nd grade students turn items in on Seesaw. All 3rd-8th grade student's complete assignments on Google Classroom. All students must log in through Clever daily for attendance purposes.

Breakfast/Lunch to Go Boxes:

Starting 11/30 boxes will be delivered to your home. There will no longer be a need to come to the school to pick boxes up, as all virtual students will receive a delivery. More information to come.

Student Illnesses: Any in person students who are exhibiting the following symptoms should stay home until the symptoms are clear. Please also call the office to let us know that your child will be absent. In addition, if your child has to be home for any amount of time virtual learning will be expected to resume while your child is home.

Symptoms include:

- Fever (must stay home 72 hours)
- Nasal congestion or runny nose (must stay home until symptoms disappears)
- Cough (must stay home until symptoms disappears or once a doctor's note is received)
- Sore throat (must stay home until symptoms disappears or once a doctor's note is received)
- Shortness of breath (monitor symptoms-connect with your doctor if needed)
- Fatigue (monitor symptoms-connect with your doctor if needed)
- Headache (monitor symptoms-connect with your doctor if needed)
- Muscle aches (monitor symptoms-connect with your doctor if needed)
- Nausea or vomiting (must stay home 24 hours, or until symptoms disappear)
- Diarrhea (must stay home 24 hours, or until symptoms disappear)
- Poor feeding or poor appetite (monitor symptoms-connect with your doctor if needed)
