The Great Commandment

Deuteronomy 6:4-7

"Hear O'Israel. The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, and with your whole being, and with your whole strength. Take to heart these words which I command you today. Keep repeating them to your children. Recite them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you get up. Bind them on your arm as a sign and let them be as a pendant on your forehead. Write them on the doorposts of your houses and on your gates."

A parent's most basic task is to help their children to live in the world that God created. Here are a few ways to keep your family in spiritual shape:

1) Family Devotions: My mother was a devoted Catholic. She would have a perpetual candle burning outside in front of the Sacred Heart. And inside she always had a candle burning in front of the Child Jesus. She would pull out Saints on different feast days and burn candles and recite prayers. Sometimes she would include us in her devotions and at other times she just wanted to be alone. One thing I know for certain is that my mother prayed. As a family, consider once a week reading a passage from the Bible and closing with the Lord's prayer. Or maybe the Rosary or the Chaplet of Mercy. Make a family devotion that your children will remember and one that isn't a burden. Keep it simple and positive.

2) Intercede for one another. Include your children in prayer requests. Ask God to provide financially. Let children know that everything comes from the Lord. When there are sorrows, sickness or prosperity, share it with one another. Face life together, not alone. A family that prays together will inevitably stay together.

3) Encourage individual prayers. Don't force, encourage. Jesus took alone time like my mother did to just be with God. Help your children to develop a relationship with God even when they are alone.

4) Talk about God's thoughts. Bring God into experiences. One of my favorite places is with nature. I love people but sometimes people get on my nerves. I loved visiting Hawaii because they did not allow businesses to post huge billboards on the highways. It really made me appreciate the natural surroundings. I am sure God has a few thoughts on the way we are constantly destroying his creations.

6. Allow your children to hear you say, "I'm Sorry". When a parent thinks they never have to say, "I'm sorry", then you've met someone who doesn't need Jesus Christ. It's a powerful message for your children to hear you admit your faults now and then. They will one day be able to do the same with their children. A family that learns to confess sins together will know the Gospel deeply, in holiness.

7. Going to Church is a Privilege. Teach your children that playing soccer instead of praying is not the better choice. Being a practicing Catholic Christian is by far the greatest privilege they will ever have in life. Don't sell your faith off.

No one has perfect children. . . but don't you want to know you did your best?


