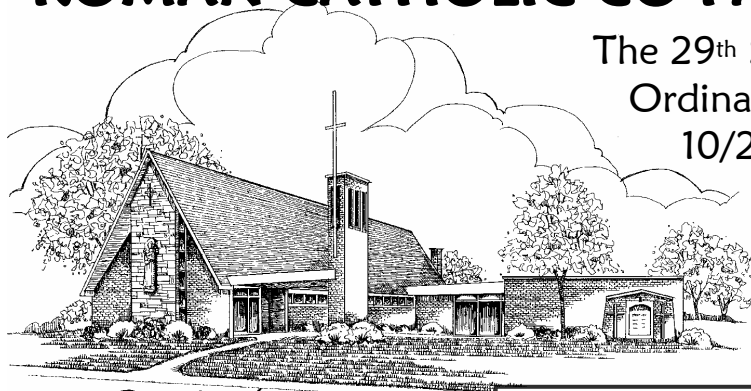


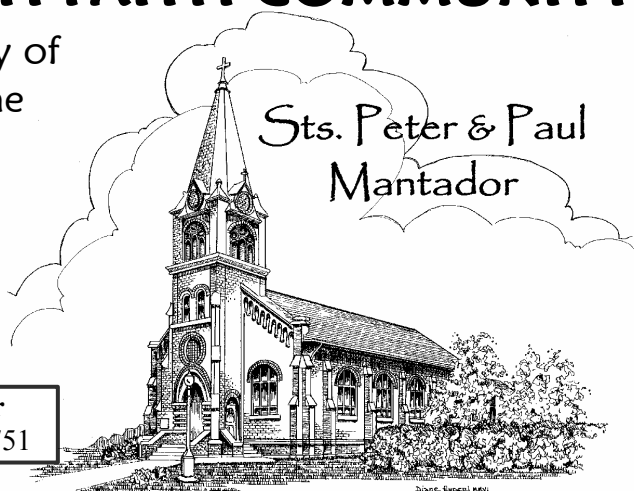

The Mission of the Church - Your Mission

Before Jesus ascended to heaven, he said, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age." He didn't say it just to the apostles 2000 years ago. He is saying it to you and me right now. Throughout the centuries, many people have heard God call them to go to the missions but others, like St Philip Neri and St Therese of Liseaux, recognized God's call to support missions in prayer, letters, and financial support while staying back home. Why do you think the Catholic Church chose St. Therese of Liseaux as the copatroness of missions when she never left Europe?

The Catechism explains our mission in detail. I will share a few highlights from CCC 849-856.

The Lord's missionary mandate is ultimately grounded in the eternal love of the Most Holy Trinity ...to make men share in the communion between the Father and the Son in their Spirit of love. (850) How and why should we share this? "for the love of Christ urges us on." to share the Good News with the person we meet. (851) We share Good News even though we experienced the "discrepancy existing between the message [the Church] proclaims and the human weakness of those to whom the Gospel has been entrusted." Each of us, taking the "way of penance and renewal," the "narrow way of the cross," can extend Christ's reign. (853) We, "the Church . . . travels the same journey as all humanity and shares the same earthly lot with the world: she is to be a leaven and, as it were, the soul of human society in its renewal by Christ and transformation into the family of God." God saves us, not our own holiness, and we want all to receive this same gift of faith in Jesus Christ and his Church. (854) We seek Christian unity so as to more clearly proclaim the Gospel, for our divisions and disunity weaken or destroy the truth of God's unity. (855) We must also be respectful in our dialogue with those who do not yet accept the Gospel, so that they are not blinded from seeing Christ because our weakness and sins fill their vision. (856)

This summary is not as rich as the actual two pages in the Catechism so please look it up online or open your copy and spend five minutes reading this inspiring call from God to each of us.

So how will you live the mission of the Church, the call of God, in your life? How will you pray and financially support the care of the poor, the proclamation of the Gospel, and the work for unity among Christians? Don't just wonder about it, ask God to make it clear and draw your heart to love beyond just friends and family. St. Therese of Liseaux, pray for us. St Ignatius of Loyola, pray for us. All you holy men and women, pray for us.
