




**Veterans Day - Remembering the Living and the Dead**

In November, we pray for God's mercy for all the deceased, especially our loved ones and people we have known. As our funeral liturgy quotes from God's Word, "They are in the hands of God." We pray for them because most of us are not living saints, we are not "holy as God is holy" and we do not seek and "love the Lord our God with all of our heart, mind, soul, and body." Yet God is merciful to those who are imperfectly just and following his commandments so he does not condemn us to hell in our brokenness and sinfulness. We have the promise of purification, the purging of our sins and attachment to things that distract us from God. Purgatory is the name given to this healing/perfecting time before the saints enter into God's eternal presence.

St Paul said "that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us." He and other saints have also said that the sufferings and purification that God allows to come to us during our lives on earth can accomplish more to prepare us for the glory of heaven when we receive and endure them with trust in God. It doesn't mean we don't question or cry out for relief, but we pray that we do not despair of the love of God.

On the 11<sup>th</sup> day of this 11<sup>th</sup> month, we also pray for our veterans - especially those who gave their lives to protect our God given inalienable rights, recognized in our constitution. We also pray for veterans still living, many have experienced fear, pain, suffering, and the horrors of battle. They carry their crosses and need us to help them, just as Simon helped Jesus during His Passion.

Today, ask yourself, "How do I help both the living and the dead in their sufferings?" Then ask God every week, "How should I, how can I, (your name here), help the person you bring to my attention this week?"

Pray to God for them (perhaps the prayer on the backside or to offer a Mass for them), whether living or deceased. Also look for an opportunity to be the eyes of God recognizing their needs, the ears of God listening when they need to talk, the feet of God walking with them, and the hands of God helping in small ways.

Many who suffer pain and loss often say that our prayers and presence do help them. Our prayers in remembrance of the dead also help the souls of the faithful departed in the purifying work of the Holy Spirit. I invite you to come to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass during these next couple weeks of November and pray for all the dead. - Fr. Kurt Gunwall

**End of Life Issues from a Catholic Perspective:** Attend a compassionate and timely Adult Education workshop on Dec 2 at St. Anthony Parish Hall at 7:00 pm, with a light supper at 6:30 pm.
