


Dying to Live

The Gospels have been longer than usual the last three Sundays. It is a gift to hear the whole story, if we can keep our attention on God and his Word.

If you watch the video link of the homily, you will hear a few things that link the three Gospels as Jesus, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, reveals himself to the Samaritan woman, the man blind from birth, and Lazarus, Martha & Mary. Do I have the faith that each of them had or do I react more like the Pharisees and those who disbelieved. As I mentioned here last week, Seeing isn't always Believing and this week we see are invited to Live truly (not just Exist or Survive).

I encourage you to stop in the Church for quiet prayer anytime during the week. Make a space in your house that is meant for prayer, sitting with God, listening to and talking with God. Set up a candle, religious art (Jesus, saints, etc.), Bible, book of prayers, etc. Here are the two Scriptures that I shared in the homily to read, meditate and memorize:

Philippians 4:11-13 - Not that I say this because of need, for I have learned, in whatever situation I find myself, to be [content]. I know indeed how to live in humble circumstances; I know also how to live with abundance. In every circumstance and in all things I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry, of living in abundance and of being in need. I have the strength for everything through him who empowers me.

Romans 8:37-39 - No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. 38 For I am sure that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, 39 nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.


