






**Mysterious Gifts**

I was going to write this weekend about the many gifts from God that we have as Catholics. We have Sacraments & Sacramentals, Feasts, Processions, Saints, and Prayers. We have so much more that is mysteriously “hidden” from casual observance; not because God wants to hide it from us but that we do not have the “eyes to see” nor the “ears to hear.” Jesus told us to see and hear his commands, his teaching, his call to love, mercy, faith, hope, joy ... But we are often distracted from going deeper by the little we see with our eyes, hear with our ears, and understand with our darkened intellect.

Then this last week, we once again saw the evil of violence and racism (by people of all colors). We saw some express their hurt and anger peacefully while others sought to destroy and harm others because of their anger. In Richland County, we may not experience the immediate effects of this round of violence and racism, but we all face the temptation of sin. If you were at Mass here this weekend, you heard the story of a friend’s dad and the new priest in their parish. How we react to the unknown is greatly shaped by how we act with our mysterious and hidden God in daily life. Prayer, quiet time, reading the Scriptures, living the Sacraments (Eucharist and Reconciliation especially) all shape how we think about and treat our neighbor. We cannot forget God’s command to Love the Lord, our God with all our heart, mind, soul, and body, and to love our neighbor as ourselves. Our **neighbor** is the Muslim, the racial supremacist, the Republican, the Democrat, the Socialist, the African-American, the Asian-American, the Latino-American, the white, Anglo-Saxon male, the ultra-feminist, the abortion supporter, etc. We also cannot forget God’s command and teaching to follow all His commands - not just ones we choose.



So before we look at the fault of others (the speck in their eye), we are commanded to acknowledge our own sins (the plank in ours) and share with others the mercy of God we receive (when we confess, repent, and seek forgiveness). Read the quotes below and to the left as a challenge and prayer for peace.

“Time is cluttered with the wreckage of broken communities which have surrendered to hatred and violence. For the salvation of our nation and the salvation of humanity, we must follow another way. This does not mean we abandon our righteous efforts. ... But we shall not, in the process, relinquish our privilege and obligation to love. ... This is the only way to create beloved communities.” – Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

### Community News



**St Ephrem** (306-373), Feast Day is June 9. Known to Syrian Christians as "the harp of the Holy Ghost," this Mesopotamian from Nisibia was baptized at 18 and may have accompanied his bishop to the Council of Nicaea in 325. He served as head of the cathedral school and left Nisibia only after it became Persian. In 363 he moved to a cave overlooking Edessa but preached frequently in the city and wrote many poems, hymns and biblical commentaries; he organized a choir of women to sing his hymns during liturgies. About 370 he visited St. Basil in Caesarea. The winter before his death, he earned praise for managing relief supplies during a severe famine in Edessa. Ephrem is the only Syrian father declared a doctor of the church.
