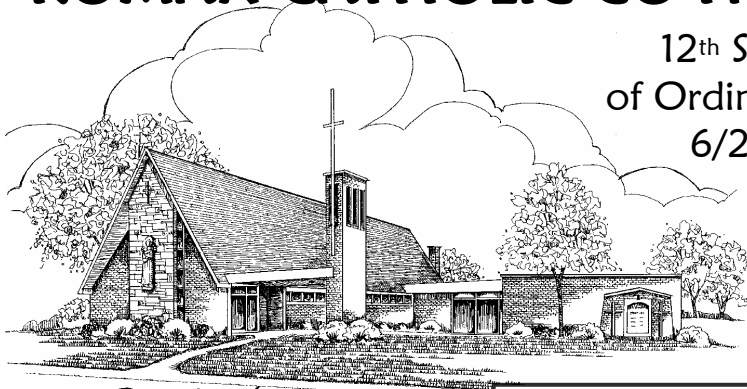


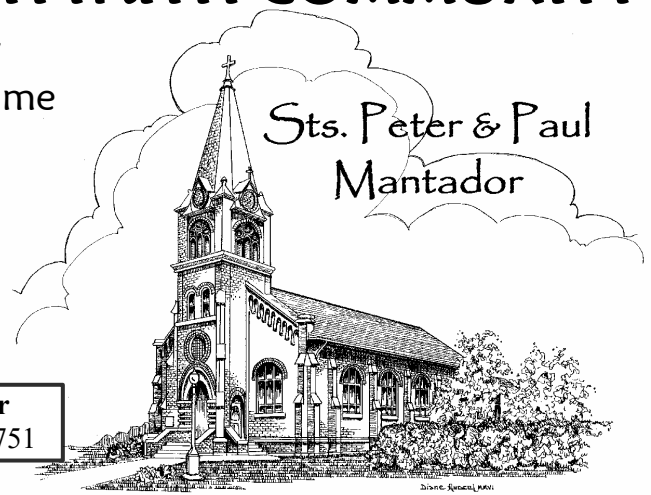

**Faith, Freedom & Fathers**

This weekend we honor our fathers - both in the flesh and in spirit. We also honor God from whom all fathers and families find our source and foundation. We pray this weekend for our fathers, grandfathers, and spiritual fathers. We pray for our nation and world to appreciate truly the unique and complementary character of fathers and mothers, men and women, in God's design for family. This is also a week of prayer in our nation for Religious Freedom here and through the world. The freedoms for which many gave their lives to protect and preserve here and abroad. Freedoms built on the inherent dignity of each person even though they are not always acknowledged - Native Americans, Blacks, Catholics, the unborn, and others. Dignity that is still not safe or fully protected because some in government and in our culture assign it based on simply human values that change, and not on eternal dignity due to our creation in the image and likeness of God.

These days preceding July 4 are selected to highlight the unity of faith, family and freedom. In May, Mary's month, we honored and prayed for mothers. Today we honor and pray for our fathers so that they may know who they are in God's sight and plan. Men have traditionally been called to protect and defend truth, goodness, justice, beauty, the poor and defenseless. That role is no longer limited in our thoughts to men alone; yet fathers have a special role in families and communities to witness by word and example to God's place in the home and Church. Predominantly mothers nurture the physical and spiritual life of children. Yet statistics repeatedly show the strong correlation between the witness of faith by the father showing whether most children will believe and practice the faith of their parents when they reach adulthood. So together let us pray for our fathers, living or deceased - those who raised us in love, those who may have been absent in any way, and those who helped nurture our spiritual life. Let us also give thanks to God, our Father, who desires our greatest good even when we do not know what that may be. Our Father who has prepared a home for us (John 14) in heaven. Our Father, who

will not leave us orphans (John 14), will never abandon us (Psalm 94), and desires that we have the fullness of life (John 10). If your father on earth has not been an example of virtue, holiness, and faith, turn to God - the Father, Son & Holy Spirit for your needs. He is faithful and loving.
