




Let us begin with a prayer for our nation and leaders so that we focus on the relationship we must have with God here and now to have an eternal relationship with God in heaven. Be attentive to both the words and the order of the prayer. We begin with praise to God, acknowledging who He is and his saving, healing, and protecting power of love working in and through us. We then pray for unity in faith, that all people be united in Christ Jesus, the Word of God, and the Truth. We also pray for unity as a nation, which is strongest when our family and our community place God first in our decisions and priorities. Since none of us and none of those in or seeking government offices are near perfection, we pray for them to lead, protect, and serve. Finally, we pray for healing and mercy individually and as a people, that we honor God in our hearts and our nation.

Please prayer this throughout this week: **Dear God, Thank you for your great power. We praise you for your Truth. We are grateful that you have set us free from the clutching grasp of sin and death. Would you be with your people, extending your grace, granting your freedom, providing your protection, and empowering with your strength. We ask that you would bring about an awakening of your presence as never seen before. We ask that your Name be proclaimed, that all plans to silence the Name of Jesus would be thwarted and crushed. We pray that many would come to know you as Lord and Savior, we pray that many would see your Light, that you would open blind eyes and release those still imprisoned.**

**We pray that you would unify your people in One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church for the glory of your Name that all who call themselves Christians would rise up, believing your great Truth. Wake us up Lord! Remind us to live aware, to redeem the time, to listen to your words, to be willing to make a difference in this land. **Gals gather July 15-18.** The theme is: "**Our Unfinished Love Story**"




**Guys gather July 19-22.** The theme is: "**To the Cor ... Man's Relationship with God**"


