

From equipping the next generation of rural priests, to forming a knowledgeable and faithful lay leadership with our Life in Christ Program, Catholic Rural Life is uniquely focused on the needs and strengths of people living in rural America. Realizing that our Catholic faith has a distinct flavor in rural areas, CRL has created a number of spiritual resources that honor these traditions.

6 Ways to Pray (find the resources mentioined on the website - www.catholicrurallife.org/resources/spiritual/)

- 1. Catholic Rural Ethic We believe that farmers and consumers need to be in solidarity. We need to once again know and understand who we are as a people of God. We need to learn again how to share and sustain the common goods of Creation. And what is not a part of creation? What does not fall into the web of life? We believe that all things are a part of creation, all people and all living things are part of one community - the community of Christ, the new creation we seek in our modern lives.
- 2. Isidore and Maria, Patron Saints of Catholic Rural Life The virtues found in the lives of Isidore and Maria commitment to family, love for the land, service to the poor and a deep spirituality – are qualities that still can be found in rural America. Pray the Litany in honor of St. Isidore.
- 3. Novena to St. Isidore This Novena to honor St. Isidore is intended for parish and home use. In the church, the leader should be the priest or someone designated by him. In the home, father, mother or child can take the lead.
- 4. Prayers for Rural Families We believe that farming is a noble profession. The farm home is a most suitable place for a Christian family. The good earth is the greatest material gift of God to man. We believe that in this vocation, country people work closely with God in producing the essential elements of life for all on earth. We believe and hold fast to the spiritual values of the farming vocation and resist the materialism of this age from blinding us to them. Let us pray that through God's grace we may have wisdom and strength to grow constantly in the virtues necessary for holy rural living.
- 5. Calendar of Blessings The Church sets aside feast days and liturgical days throughout the year to help us remember and celebrate our spiritual lives. At Catholic Rural Life, we take particular interest in the cycles of nature and seek ways to unite the

change of seasons with the constant Word of the liturgy. 
