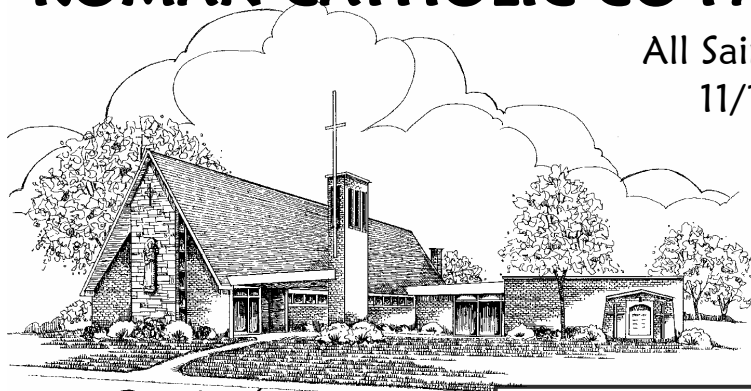
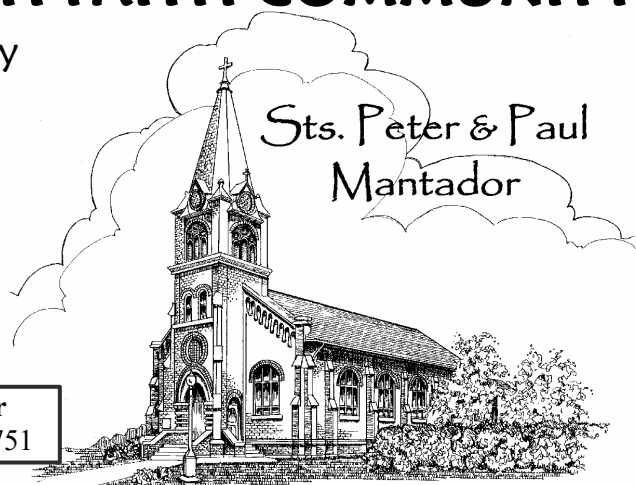

Saints & Prayers

This month of November begins with two days that remind us of the unity of the Church, the Body of Christ. This is a truth of the fullness of the Catholic Faith that we have to share with other Christians and all people of good will. We are united to the Saints Triumphant, the saints in heaven, who pray for us perfectly - they do not sleep, they are not distracted, and they are righteous before God, purified from any attachment to sin. Thanks be to God for their presence - our older brothers and sisters in faith who lived before us and now inspire us and intercede for us.

We are also united to the Saints Suffering, the saints in purgatory, whom we pray for on All Souls Day and every time a Mass is offered for a deceased loved one. They need our prayers as God finishes purifying them of any attachment to sin that holds them back from the glory of His presence in Heaven. Like our own family, our prayers are a way to love and serve family members who cannot take care of themselves any longer. See the box for a brief description about Mass intentions.

We are the Church Militant, fighting the battle between sin and virtue in our heart, mind, and soul. We need the prayers of others and we are responsible to pray for one another. This is our unity in Jesus Christ!

Please pray for our nation in these ways!

1. Pray and fast on Monday, November 2 - that's where it all starts.
2. Spend an hour in prayer or Eucharistic Adoration on Tuesday for the conversion of hearts.
3. Implore the Blessed Mother's intercession throughout the day; light a candle so that God's light may shine on all.
4. Pray the Rosary together as a family on Monday and Tuesday.

Mass Intentions

When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three intentions: First, to offer the Mass reverently and validly... Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church. Third, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

The tradition of offering Masses for others, particularly the dead, originates in the very early Church. Inscriptions discovered on tombs in Roman catacombs of the second century evidence this practice: for example, the epitaph on the tomb of Abercius (d. 180), Bishop of Hieropolis in Phrygia, begs for prayers for the repose of his soul. Tertullian (c. 200) attested to observing the anniversary of a spouse with prayers and sacrifices, i.e. the Mass... {excerpts from www.catholicexchange.com/what-are-mass-intentions-2}

Stewardship Moment: "Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you (falsely) because of me." (Matthew 5:11)

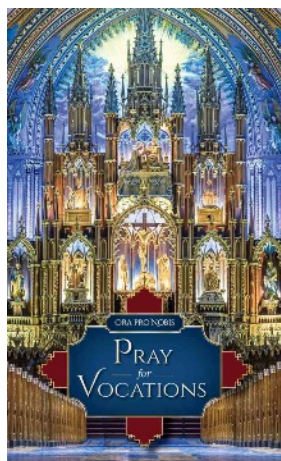
