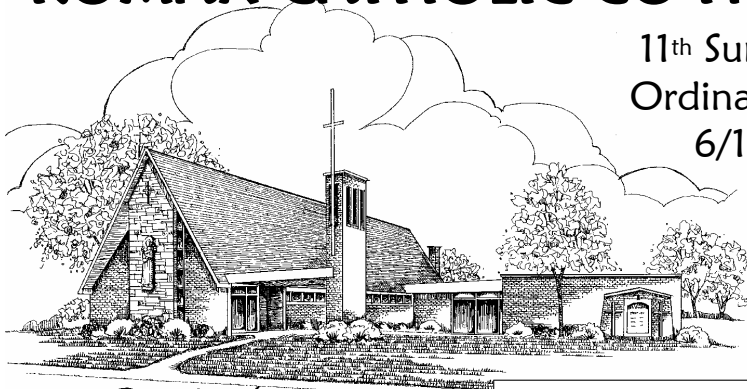


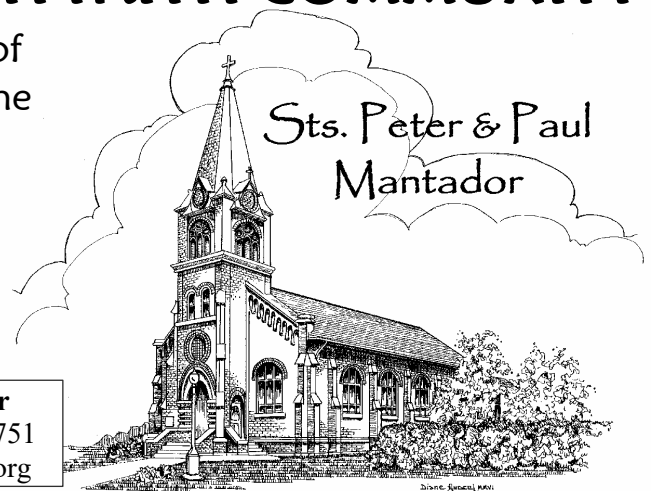

The Week in Review

This last week included a wide variety of activities - personal and ministerial, fun and work, responsibilities and relaxing. Once in a while people ask what a priest does all week. The answer varies greatly between a large city parish and smaller rural parishes but what I experienced this last week would be similar in either setting. Friday & Saturday - Anointing and communion to a parishioner and dinner with a few priests before the Ordinations of three deacons and one priest. Briefly stopped by a graduation party on the way home. (I missed most graduation parties this year.) Sunday - Masses followed by a quick lunch and drive to Fargo to bring the Anointing of the Sick to a parishioner and a short visit with members of his family. Afterward, to enjoy some time off on a beautiful and warm Sunday, I visited friends just finishing a small graduation party and another visit with friends I haven't seen in months. I returned to Mooreton to get some rest before the week began.

Monday - chiropractor and haircut in Wahpeton and then prepared for the Funeral Vigil in Hankinson. Lots of short visits at the vigil and a brief visit to Msgr. Donahue & Fr. Goellen in Hankinson. Missed a treat from the Dakota Drive-Inn on two attempts.



Tuesday - Funeral, burial and luncheon at Sts Peter & Paul. Funerals can be tough sometimes; this one was a celebration of a blessed life for many family and friends present. The evening included a meeting about the structure of the parish Circles at St Anthony. It was a good discussion and will provide good organization as we continue serving the parish.

Wednesday - began with Exposition of the Eucharist at St Anthony's. Then I made a visit to a family from a nearby parish who's pastor is on retreat. They needed the anointing of the sick and prayer with the whole family before a risky surgery. I returned to Mooreton and an errand in Wahpeton. A short online meeting with Bishop Folda and a few other priests, Mass, and then took Pat to Antelope Creek for supper. We ran into parishioners and had a good visit and relaxing evening.

Thursday - began with Mass in Mantador and then into Wahpeton for a workshop on Suicide Desperation and how we can ask, recognize, help, and provide assistance for the many directly affected and many more who are concerned for someone in their life. We saw a few familiar faces also attending. Dinner and visit afterward with a parish family. The evening ended with late night calls to help arrange another anointing in Fargo before a family friend went in for heart bypass surgery the next morning.

Friday - Morning Mass, work on the bulletin and weekend material, and then traveled to Fargo to have dinner and visit with a seminary classmate from Phoenix who is in the area for a funeral.

This was a more intense week than usual, but it was filled with common things - celebrating the Sacraments (Mass, Confession, Anointing), office work, visits, errand, unexpected needs, continuing my education, meetings, and more. The life of a priest is not too different than a family with many responsibilities and opportunities each day in planned & unplanned ways. God guide you this week!
