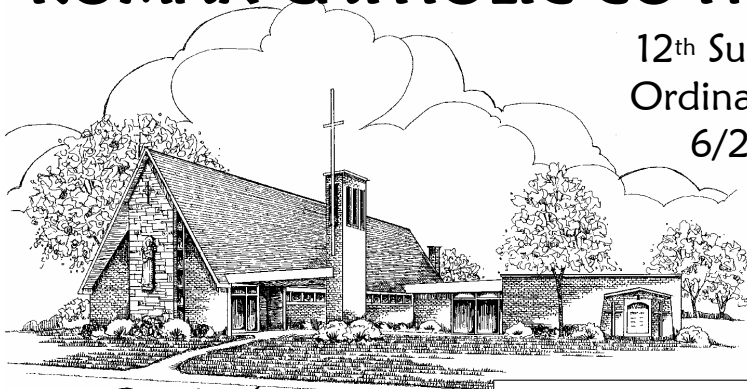


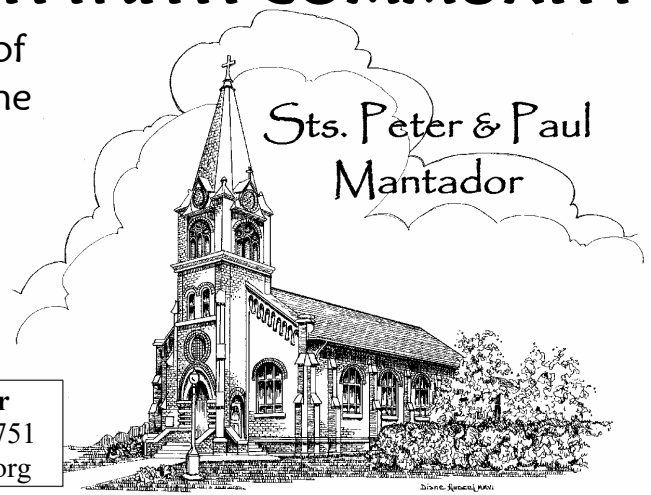

Listen to Him - Made for Greatness Men's retreat, July 16-18 at Sticklestad Lodge (near Fort Ransom)

Why a Men's Retreat? In the 16th century, St. Ignatius of Loyola observed that the key to growing in the spiritual life is first to become aware of what is happening in our hearts and our minds that are often preoccupied and distracted. Only after becoming aware of our interior life are we then able to understand the different movements within us, both good and bad, and then take the appropriate action to either accept the actions of God or reject those that are opposed to Him. The ancient practice of getting away from the hustle and bustle of life is one of the most potent ways of cultivating this awareness.

The **Made for Greatness Men's Retreat** is all about helping men to grow closer to God through becoming aware of what is taking place within them and then bringing that to God. Along with this, we will strive to invite Christ into the areas where barriers within us prevent us from receiving His love and mercy. The retreat will feature Mass with Bishop John Folda, opportunities for confessions, time for prayer and reflection, along with some profound spiritual insights.

This weekend is about cultivating a genuinely peaceful spirit, and it is done in a fully masculine context. Sticklestad Lodge is a corporate hunting retreat lodge that features things like trap shooting, campfires, and outdoor games. The food will be cooked on an outdoor smoker throughout the weekend (check out the website to see the full menu).
