### Parish Information

#### Active Parishioner Status

We receive requests from people who live in Jessamine County who wish to serve as witnesses for weddings or to be godparents or sponsors for the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. Part of that request is to be able to verify that a person is an "active member" here. An active member of a parish is defined as one who:

- Is properly registered and on the parish rolls.
- Faithfully attends Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation
- Participates in parish activities when possible
- Uses the parish envelope system.

While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.

Law of Abstinence—No meat is permitted for persons 14 years of age and older.

Day of Abstinence—All Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday (4/10/20)

Law of Fast—Allows one full meal and two lighter meals; prohibits eating between meals; obliges persons 18-59 years of age.

Day of Fasting—Good Friday (4/10/20)

Easter Sunday is April 12, 2020

## Diocesan Information:

All public Masses in the Catholic Diocese of Lexington will be suspended as of Tuesday, March 17, until further notice. Funerals will be permitted as long as maximum care is given to assuring the recommended social distancing. Other events should be rescheduled as much as possible. Noting “the outcry of the medical community and wanting to do our part to help contain the spread of the coronavirus,” Bishop John Stowe, OFM Conv., communicated this decision to the priests of the diocese on March 16. “Let us pray for our people and our world and be creative in our outreach through social media and other means to continue to make this a meaningful Lent, despite the unusual circumstances,” Bishop Stowe said. The Catholic Diocese of Lexington covers 50 counties in central and eastern Kentucky and has 58 parishes and missions and 15 Catholic schools.

Se permitirán los funerales siempre que se preste la máxima atención para garantizar el distanciamiento social recomendado. Otros eventos deben reprogramarse tanto como sea posible. Al observar "la protesta de la comunidad médica y queriendo hacer nuestra parte para ayudar a contener la propagación del coronavirus", el obispo John Stowe, OFM Conv., les comunicó esta decisión a los sacerdotes de la diócesis el 16 de marzo. "Oremos por nuestra gente y nuestro mundo y seamos creativos en nuestro alcance a través de las redes sociales y otros medios para continuar haciendo de esta una Cuaresma significativa, a pesar de las circunstancias inusuales", dijo el Obispo Stowe. La Diócesis Católica de Lexington cubre 50 condados en el centro y este de Kentucky y tiene 58 parroquias y misiones y 15 escuelas católicas.

## Parish and Sacramental Information

**Sacrament of Reconciliation**—Confessions are heard on Saturday from 3:45 to 4:15 p.m. and on Sunday 20 minutes before each Mass. Confessions may also be heard upon request. Communal Penance Services are announced in the bulletin.

**Sacrament of Baptism**—Parents must be registered, active members of St. Luke for two months before their child can be Baptized. They must also attend instructions prior to Baptism. Call the parish office to make arrangements.

**Sacrament of Marriage**—Six months' notice and completion of the diocesan marriage preparation program is required. Call the parish office for arrangements.

**Instructions in the Faith**—A program of formation and information (R.C.I.A.) is offered each year beginning in September. Call or email the Rectory for more information.

**Sick and Shut-Ins**—Please notify the Rectory when you or someone in your family is ill, in the hospital, or unable to attend Mass—especially if you would like to receive a visit and/or Communion.

**Parish Membership**—You are invited to register by calling in person at the Rectory or by submitting a completed registration card found on the stand in the church vestibule.


