Living Jesus Prayer

Heavenly Father, pour forth your Holy Spirit to inspire us with words from Holy Scripture. Stir in our souls the desire to renew our faith and deepen our relationship with your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ so that we might truly believe in and live the Good

News. Open our hearts to hear the Gospel and grant us the confidence to proclaim the Good News to others. Pour out your Spirit, so that we might be strengthened to deepen our faith, grow in confidence to proclaim the Gospel, and boldly witness to the saving grace of your Son, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Communion Procedures

1. Approach each Communion station one section at a time, from the pew closest to the Communion station, to the back.
2. You may leave your bulletin and worship aid at your seat to avoid any fumbling with facemask and Communion.
3. Everyone should get out of the pew and follow the flow of people, even if not receiving Holy Communion. You may ask for a blessing or cross your arms in front of your chest without speaking and the Communion minister should know to not distribute to you. This is a safety measure: we do not want people climbing over other people in the pews.
4. Anyone who has special needs or trouble walking should be seated in an appropriate handicap pew. The minister will bring you Communion before or after everyone else has received.
5. Please remove your facemask only as you face the person distributing.
6. It is strongly recommended that you receive Communion on the hand only.
7. Return your facemask after receiving.
8. Return to your seat via the recommended aisle, but remain socially distant.
9. After Communion, you must return to your seat. No one is permitted to leave the Church after Communion during the pandemic. If you want to leave after Communion, you should not come to Church at this time.
10. After Mass, all will be dismissed by ushers pew by pew to exit the church.

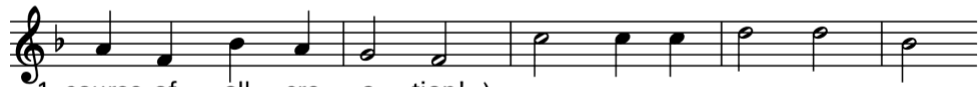
