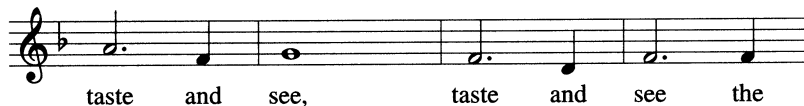
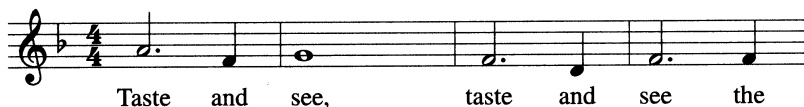
On Mission Prayer
