

Bishop Canevin HS Mission Trip 2020

Sunday, July 12 – Saturday, July 18, 2020

Application Period: Dec. 3– Dec. 20, 2019

\$50 non-refundable deposit required with application

Total cost: \$250 (\$50 deposit + \$200)

Overview: We will be working at Immaculate Conception Parish, City Mission, the Highland Ridge Community Development Corporation, Washington County Food Bank, and Habitat for Humanity, to offer hands-on service to individuals in need in and around the city of Washington.

Mission Trip participants form a sense of community and camaraderie while working together on projects throughout the day, staying on campus in the dorms of Washington & Jefferson College, and grow in group fellowship and spirituality through evening reflections. Meals will be provided for at the W&J Newman Center.

Requirements for participating in the Mission Trip:

- Students must be in good standing at BCHS in terms of discipline and academics.
- All service hours for the 2019-2020 school year must be completed before final acceptance.
- Diocesan policy requires those participants 18 years of age or older to submit the appropriate clearances and enroll in the Diocese's Safe Environment database.
- Students must complete a BCHS Field Trip Permission Form and an In Loco Parentis Medical Form, as well as any waivers or other forms required by the agencies with whom we are collaborating.
- Students must agree to abide by the rules and policies established by the facilitators of the Mission Trip.
- Students must participate in the entirety of the trip unless special permission is obtained from the Mission Trip facilitators.
- All medications must be pre-approved by the Mission Trip facilitators and will be dispensed appropriately by an adult chaperone. Students should not keep any medications in their possession or take medications on their own with the exception of an epi-pen, and inhaler, or other items approved by the facilitators.
