Our Departments & Programs

Crisis Assistance & Self-Sufficiency Services Department

Consists of 6 programs that work together to help in a time of crisis when the need is immediate as well as offering long-term assistance through self-sufficiency.

Catholic Charities - Flour Bluff

Assisting those in need in the Flour Bluff and NAS-Corpus Christi communities with a food pantry, toiletries/personal hygiene items, SNAP application assistance, Children's Weekend Lunch Program through FBISD, and referrals, as well as, providing a link to other Catholic Charities services. *established 2016*

Emergency Aid Program

Provides emergency assistance with food through a Choice Pantry at 615 Oliver Ct., as well as assisting with the operation of 6 remote food pantries, financial assistance with electric and utility bills and rent and rent deposits for Nueces and rural counties, and other emergency needs. Assists with the completion and submission of SNAP applications. Diabetes awareness through our Community Health Worker. *established 1968*

Financial Empowerment Classes and the Suit Up Program

Our Financial Empowerment Classes are six week sessions of weekly classes, developed for individuals and families who wish to improve their financial situation, eliminate dependency, and are motivated to change their lives. The Suit Up Program offers new and gently used men's suits and accessories, resume building assistance, and employment resourcing. *established 2008*

Prescription Assistance Program

Comprehensive program available to assist clients in finding the least-cost formulary for their monthly prescription medications. *established 2009*

Disaster Response Services

Continuing to provide long-term help to Hurricane Harvey survivors. Working towards meeting the needs of the 12 counties we serve through preparation, relief and recovery in response to future disasters. *established 2017*

Children & Family Services Department

Parents as Teachers Program

Parents are empowered to be their child's first teacher by increasing parent knowledge of early childhood development and improving parenting practices. Free home-visiting program for Nueces County. Ages 0 to 5. *established 2009*

Community Outreach Services Department

Embraces the needs of those in the community who are vulnerable or disabled. Our two programs work side by side and together to enrich their lives by Providing Help and Creating Hope.

Ministry & Life Enrichment for Persons with Disabilities Program

Promotes spiritual, social, and educational skills for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, blind or visually impaired, deaf or hard of hearing, and their families. *established 1983*



Representative Payee Program

Provides assistance to the most vulnerable members of the community; the young, the elderly, and the disabled who are unable to manage their SSA, SSI, and or VA benefits. *established 1971*

Counseling Department

Strengthening and improving mental health of individuals and families. Providing professional counseling and support to enrich lives physically, emotionally, spiritually, and socially. *established 1986*

Immigration Department

Providing immigration legal services, education, and representation. *established 1985*

Mother Teresa Shelter, Inc.

Providing comprehensive, community-based outreach services to homeless individuals and families, creating opportunities to help break the cycle of homelessness. Weekly group counseling sessions. Incorporating learning and social activities through the Multi-Purpose Activity and Therapeutic Center. *established 2001*

Mother Teresa Transitional Housing for Men

Providing housing for 24 single men for a period of 24 months or less. Includes private rooms, ADA restrooms and showers, laundry facilities, commercial kitchen, recreational area, dog kennel, and security-enhanced grounds. Offering support services including self-sufficiency workshops and continuing education. *established 2012*
