Mass for 75th Anniversary of the Liberation of Paris at the Cathedral

All are welcome at a Mass of Thanksgiving marking the 75th anniversary of the Liberation of Paris, organized by the First Alliance Foundation, to be celebrated at 10am on Thursday, August 29 at the Cathedral. The Schola Cantorum will provide music using works from French sources throughout. The Liberation of Paris was a military battle that took place during World War II, culminating in the German garrison surrendering the French capital on August 25, 1944. The Free French diplomatic mission to the U. S. held a Thanksgiving Mass at St. Matthew's Cathedral on August 26, 1944 to commemorate the event. General Charles de Gaulle, military leader of the Free French who on August 26, 1944 became the president of the Provisional French Government, held a Mass that day at Nôtre-Dame Cathedral in Paris. The Cathedral of St. Matthew the Apostle is located at 1725 Rhode Island Avenue, NW, between Connecticut Avenue and 17th Street, near the Red Line Farragut North Metro station.
