

Gospel

Matthew 11:25-30

At that time Jesus exclaimed: "I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to little ones. Yes, Father, such has been your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son wishes to reveal him."

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."

The dispensation from the Sunday and Holy Days of obligation remains in effect and you may have to make the difficult decision to remain at home even as we offer public Masses. Those with COVID-19 or exposed to it, as well as those with upper respiratory or flu like symptoms or underlying medical conditions, the sick, the elderly, those who are living with or in the presence of any individual at risk, or those that still do not feel comfortable being in a public setting, we ask that you consider staying at home.

A Letter from Fr. Pablo Bonello

Dear Parishioners,

Indeed, each baptized person has been endowed Christians with a priesthood that enables them to offer sacrifices, especially, the sacrifice of the Cross.

St. Peter Chrysologus offers to our consideration the words of St. Paul: “*I appeal to you by the mercy of God to present your bodies as a sacrifice, living and holy.*” (Romans 12:1) Our saint adds: “*Each of us is called to be both a sacrifice to God and his priest.*”

1st) Each of us is called to be “*a sacrifice*”. Our saint tells us what we are to offer: “*Do not forfeit what divine authority confers on you. Put on the garment of holiness, gird yourself with the belt of chastity. Let Christ be your helmet, let the cross on your forehead be your unfailing protection. Your breastplate should be the knowledge of God that he himself has given you. Keep burning continually the sweet smelling incense of prayer. Take up the sword of the Spirit. Let your heart be an altar.*”

We offer God, His gifts – “*what divine authority confers on you*”-, such as holiness, chastity, daily Cross, faith, and prayer. In this way, we make our heart an altar where God is glorified through a life of virtues.

2nd) “*Each of us is called to be (God’s) priest*”: We ask ourselves, **who** offers? **First of all**, it is Christ Himself: He offers our sacrifices when He offered His own life on the Cross. **Secondly**, **each of us**, and this aspect must not be neglected, Jesus wanted to join our personal cooperation to His Sacrifice. Indeed, at Mass we exercise our baptismal priesthood in a very special way. At Mass we offer our entire lives through the hands of the ministerial priest, who acts in the person of Christ.

St. Chrysologus declares the main virtues that should inspire our sacrifice: “*Then, with full confidence in God, present your body for sacrifice. God desires not death, but faith; God thirsts not for blood, but for self-surrender; God is appeased not by slaughter, but by the offering of your free will.*” In other words, full of confidence, present your life to God, inspired by faith, self-surrender, and free will, because this is what God wills.
