Gospel
Mark 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick— no food, no sack, no money in their belts.

They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic.

He said to them, “Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave.

Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them.”

So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

The Hyde Amendment, contained in the federal government’s annual appropriations legislation, prohibits federal funding of domestic abortions, except in cases of rape, incest or to save the life of the mother. It is a bipartisan provision that has been part of federal appropriations for 45 years (since 1976) and enjoys overwhelming public support, including strong support from low-income women, and women of color. The Hyde Amendment has served as the model for dozens of other federal policies that prohibit the government from funding abortion in other areas (for example, in foreign assistance programs, trafficking programs, community health programs, or health insurance). In addition to being widely supported by Americans, Hyde and Hyde-related policies save lives and respect the consciences of Americans. A Letter from Fr. Pablo Bonello

Dear Parishioners,

Last week we considered the Blessed Virgin Mary and her relationship to the sacrament of the Cross before the Passion of Christ, as St. John Paul II highlights, *Mary, throughout her life at Christ's side and not only on Calvary, made her own the sacrificial dimension of the Eucharist.* (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, 56)

Today we will contemplate Mary and Jesus during the Passion. God willing, next week we will consider her relationship to the Eucharist after the Passion, from the Ascension of Christ until her Assumption into heaven.

Two hearts were crucified on Mount Calvary: The Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. And with all those sufferings Jesus consecrated her as our Mother: “*behold your Son*”, He said to Mary; and we were consecrated as her children: “*behold your Mother*”, He said to John. And **Mary** took us into her heart; and **St. John** welcomed her into own his life, with everything that was in her heart: grace, love –and sorrows.

St. John Paul II:

*In the “memorial” of Calvary all that Christ accomplished by his passion and his death is present. Consequently **all that Christ did with regard to his Mother for our sake is also present.** To her he gave the beloved disciple and, in him, each of us: “Behold, your Son!”. To each of us he also says: “Behold your mother!” (cf. Jn 19: 26-27). (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, 57)*

That's why *the commemoration of Mary has always been part of the Eucharistic celebrations of the Churches of East and West.* (Idem). That's why we commend ourselves to her after communion.
