

Dear Beloved People of Divine Savior and our cherished visitors:

A key point in this Sunday's Gospel is the reference in the first sentence that Jesus is "making His way to Jerusalem." The Gospel writer Luke wants us to keep that very important detail in mind as the tension between Jesus and those who don't agree with Him becomes more intense as Jesus gets closer to Jerusalem. In our first reading, Jerusalem is referred to as the Lord's holy mountain. Mountains are seen throughout the Bible as a primary location for people to experience the Presence of God, who wants to be in loving relationship with the people that God created. Key figures that had this experience include but are hardly limited to Moses, Elijah and Jesus. We know from our own experience how mountains provide us with a scene in which we praise the awesomeness of God's creation.

Back to our Gospel: in response to the somewhat strange question as to how many people will be saved, Jesus invites us to strive to enter through the narrow gate. Jesus intimates that many will not be strong enough. While the Gospel doesn't say, we would not be far off to consider that Jesus means that we are not strong enough in our relationship with God nor that we have lived out that relationship. Some think that the narrow gate refers to a relatively small gate through which strangers were allowed to enter the Holy City. An example is that one has to remove all the materials a camel is carrying in order for the camel to slowly drag himself through while lying on the ground. Strength might also refer to how fully we can divest ourselves of anything that is not useful in our efforts to make known the goodness and kindness of our Divine Savior.

Jesus uses very strong language to emphasize how useless it is just to have some minor or fleeting connection or relationship with Jesus. What is of utmost importance to Jesus is the degree to which all of us fulfill what Isaiah made clear was the mission that Jesus made His own and that we are to make our own, especially given what is going on in our country these days. As our first reading makes clear, our mission is to go to places that have never heard of God's grandeur and to proclaim in every way possible that very awesomeness of the God of Jesus who loves all the people God created. Our role is none other than to bring all of our sisters and brothers from all the nations and empower them to know the goodness of the Lord by the way that we welcome them and provide for them.

Our fulfillment comes the more we see all people as our brothers and sisters, as the beloved creation of God whose needs we are to take care of. It is not brain surgery to realize how far from this mark are many of the ways in which people coming to our country are treated, especially babies and children. Our psalm for today expresses a similar idea, namely, that we are to "go out to all the world and tell the good news." We have a choice, to do as God wishes, or to find ourselves wailing and grinding our teeth when we see people coming to the Lord's house from all points and we are left outside the heavenly banquet.

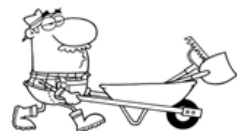

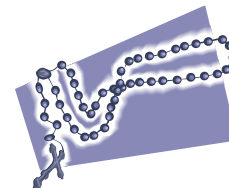
