

Dear Beloved People of Divine Savior and our cherished visitors:

None of us needs to be reminded of the concerns we have about what the next point of turmoil could be. Our first reading for today provides us with very hopeful words: "write down the vision clearly...so that one can read it readily. For the vision still has its time." The last sentence of this reading states that "the rash one has no integrity; but the just one, because of his faith, shall live." How fascinating, then, that the apostles in our Gospel passage ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus no doubt was smiling when he responded with the words "if you have faith the size of a mustard seed..." Jesus is saying to those apostles and to us that it is not a matter of "if we have faith", it is a matter of "given that we have faith."

The disciples in turn might have responded that they had no interest in replanting a tree in the sea. They were feeling overwhelmed at their growing awareness of what Jesus was asking of His followers. Jesus had recently told two parables about money, greediness, self-centeredness and critical thinking in a time of crisis. In other words, Jesus was calling His disciples as He calls all of us to place our security in the goodness of God. Jesus was asking them to follow His example, which was no doubt daunting to Jesus's first followers, not unlike our wondering if we are up to the mission. They thought they needed an increase of faith, and Jesus is asking them and us to realize that faith is a gift graciously instilled in us at our conception. Being created through the wonders of God's graciousness, God provides us what we need in order to deal well with the challenges of life.

Our first reading can easily awaken within us an awareness of how troubling our times are, what with the violence that exists, the extent of misery that so many people suffer, not to mention how much strife prevails as well as clamorous discord. To all this Jesus speaks about our role as servants. The primary point being made is that all is gift from our all-generous God. It is simply not appropriate to think we have a right to demand anything from God any more than a servant coming in from the field can expect to sit down and be served. Our role of servant is an on-going adventure. While the last words of today's Gospel seem quite harsh, the point they convey is that we come to realize how blessed we are to be able to serve God and one another as our way of being grateful for all the goodness that we enjoy.

It is difficult to take in and to realize that anchoring our security in God not only does not diminish us, but the greater we entrust ourselves to God the more fulfilling our lives will be. The words of our second reading frame our disposition: "bear your share of hardship for the Gospel with the strength that comes from God." God might ask a great deal from us, but God's blessings eliminate any sense that we think we deserve better from God. We pray that we come to realize what a great honor it is to find every way possible to serve our God by transforming aspects of our world that are not in line with God's vision.
