You can spend an hour with Jesus in many ways: reading the Holy Bible, with a favorite prayer book, praying the Rosary or speaking to Jesus heart-to-heart. You may want to come to just sit and relax and enjoy the sweet peace that comes from simply being with the one who loves you most.

What Adoration Means

Pope Francis obviously sees a deep connection between believing and doing. If we believe that Jesus is "really present in the Eucharist," we will take action in his name. True belief is more than acknowledging something with our minds. It involves letting our hearts be transformed so fully that we feel the need to reach out in loving and compassionate service to others. Adoration, Pope Francis says, involves both belief and action.
