Isaiah describes the joy and salvation which will accompany the coming of Christ. He compares the plants which spring from a garden to the justice that will spring from all nations.

## Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

We take our stress and worry and turmoil to the Lord, Who calmed the sea and Who kept St. Peter from sinking. 
