HOW TO PUT OUR PARISH IN YOUR WILL :

After providing for your families and loved ones, parishioners may want to include the Parish in your wills, thus helping to assure the long-term future of the Parish and the work that must continue in generations to come. Bequests are free of estate tax and can substantially reduce the amount of your assets claimed by the government. You can give needed support to either of our Parishes by simply including the following words in your will: "I give, devise and bequeath to Church of the Annunciation Parish Charitable Trust in Ludlow, Vermont... or... Holy Name of Mary Parish Charitable Trust in Proctorsville, Vermont (insert amount being given here) to be used to support the ministry of the Parish".

A bequest can be a specific amount, a specific piece of property, a percentage of an estate, or all or part of the residue of an estate. You can also name the Parish as a contingency beneficiary in the event someone named in your will is no longer living. It is recommended that a lawyer help in drafting or amending a will.

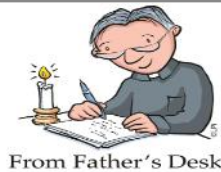

From Father's Desk

On Saturday, October 31st of this year, Father Michael McGivney, founder of The Knights of Columbus, was beatified by the Universal Church in a ceremony which took place in Hartford, Connecticut, making him the newest "Blessed" in both the United States and in the Universal Church. Beatification is an interval step in the process of Canonization in which he one day might be declared a Saint.

Blessed Michael McGivney was born to Irish immigrant parents on August 12, 1852 in Waterbury, Connecticut, the eldest of thirteen children. He attended the local public schools until the age of 16 when he entered the Seminary in Quebec. He took a leave of absence when his father died in 1873, in order to assist in the raising of his siblings. He re-entered the Seminary in Baltimore, and was ordained a priest on December 22, 1877.

From his own experience, Father McGivney recognized the devastating effect on immigrant families of the untimely death of the father and wage earner. On March 29, 1882, he founded the Knights of Columbus as a mutual aid society, to provide financial assistance in the event of men's deaths, to their widows and orphans. The organization developed as a fraternal society. Father McGivney was also known for his tireless work among his parishioners. He died from pneumonia at the age of 38 on the Eve of the Assumption in 1890.

On March 15, 2008, Pope Benedict XVI approved a decree recognizing McGivney's heroic virtue, thus declaring him as "Venerable." On May 27, 2020 a miracle attributed to his intercession was approved by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, leading to his Beatification last week.

The Knights of Columbus has developed into the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization with more than two million members who, during the fraternal year 2019 donated \$187 million to charity as well as performing 77 million hours of charitable and parochial work. Our parish chapter of the Knights of Columbus has 35 members; Father Mosher serves as Chaplain. Now begins prayer for Blessed Michael's canonization as well as hopes for miracles performed through his intercession. Blessed Michael McGivney, pray for us.
