TODAY'S GOSPEL TELLS...

...the disciples on the road to Emmaus. This is a very popular passage to study and pray with! One important theme that speaks to us particularly as disciples is the urgent need to share a story! When the two disciples in this story recognized Jesus and understood all they'd heard that evening, they "set out at once and returned to Jerusalem." This was probably a seven mile walk! They couldn't wait to tell the other disciples gathered there what had happened! There is a burning need within us all to tell our stories; we want to share our experiences with others! We are called first to share the gospel, but we are also called to share our personal stories in light of the gospel. As Missionary Disciples, we should reflect on our own conversion stories and share them with others. Jesus told us to go and make disciples of all nations. This means His story must be shared over and over again, and He has given us the Holy Spirit to Empower us to do so.

APRIL 26: SAINT RADBERTUS



When Radbertus was just a baby, his parents left him on the doorsteps of the Notre Dame of Soissons convent, because they could not take care of him. The nuns loved and cared for him and when he was old enough to go to school he was sent to St. Peter's monastery nearby. Radbertus loved to learn; his favorite subject in school was Latin. When he was old enough, he joined the monastery and became a monk. He wrote many books and was a very good teacher. He traveled all around Europe using his wisdom to bring peace to many different religious and political disagreements. He spent the last few years of his life as a hermit (living alone with God) praying and studying.
