**JUNE 7: ST. ANNE OF ST. BARTHOLOMEW**



Born into a peasant family (farmers), Anne grew up and became a shepherdess. She lived close to Avila, which is where the Carmelite nuns lived; they were run by St. Theresa of Avila. Anne asked to join this convent and was accepted as a lay sister instead of a Cloistered nun. This allowed her to run errands and do some of the work outside of the convent walls that the other sisters could not do. St. Theresa began to know Blessed Anne and liked her so much that she chose her to be her travel buddy, as she visited other convents or started new convents in Europe. Anne was with St. Theresa a lot and learned so much from her. After St. Theresa died Anne continued doing some of the work that she had helped St. Theresa do while she was alive. She was sent to open a convent in France and then she opened some in the Netherlands and Belgium. Many rich and very well educated girls joined the convents that Anne helped start and she reminded Jesus that she was only a shepherd girl and maybe he should choose someone else to do this important work. Jesus reminded her that straw can start a very big fire and through Anne's work many women's hearts caught on fire with love for Jesus.

**IT IS SAID...**

...that the will of God will not lead you where the grace of God will not protect you. As missionary disciples, we often face tasks that seem daunting or unmanageable. We certainly see that today in the reading from Exodus. Moses has been asked to lead the "stiff necked" Israelites to the promised land, but they are troubled by their own unfaithfulness. So God joins them. They carry the Ark of the Covenant as a reminder of God's physical presence with them as they make the difficult journey. In John's Gospel, we see the renewal of that covenant in Jesus Christ, who was sent to live and move amongst us and to die for our sins. Then, after Jesus' ascension, God sent the Holy Spirit to dwell within us! God may ask us to do some difficult work, but He never abandons us to do the work on our own. He is with us "even to the end of the age."

We have entered June! I'm still looking for the months of February, March, April, and May, but I guess I should leave those behind and enjoy the warmth of summertime. This summer is shaping up to look very different. Our youth will not be attending Totus Tuus at the parish or at camp, Steubenville was cancelled, Prayer and Action was cancelled. We have not been able to schedule Brewing the Faith, graduation parties, or our annual parish picnic.

I participated in a Zoom meeting with the bishop on Thursday. There are currently no changes coming toward loosening the guidelines for attending Mass, receiving other sacraments, or for parish gatherings. I remain hopeful that those changes will come as soon as possible and that we will still be allowed to arrange a few summer activities. Activities that may still happen include Brewing the Faith, our summer picnic, and some way of honoring our graduates.

There is one new activity that is being discussed. Our brass ensemble (called Acclaim) is working on some patriot music for your enjoyment. It is our hope to hold an outdoor concert on June 28<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 PM. You will be invited to bring your own lawn chairs, picnic basket of drinks and food, and lawn blanket. Each family would need to be responsible to provide their own food and drink while maintaining social distancing. I'm giving you a heads up for scheduling purposes. This is planned for the weekend prior to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July so that you do not have to forgo other holiday plans already scheduled.

I would like to thank the parish for the surprise "Honkabrator" that you pulled off last Sunday in celebration of my 50<sup>th</sup> birthday. I was truly surprised that so many of you would come back to the parish in the afternoon to do that. I am most grateful for your love of me as it is expressed in your expressions of care and appreciation. The connections we have built over the past two years mean a great deal to me and I'm pleased, honored, and excited to be your pastor. May the Lord and our bishop grant me many more years with all of you.

**Mass Attendance**

Mass attendance went up this past weekend, rising from 214 the previous weekend to 271 this past weekend. We have been using our parish center for the overflow beyond the 1/3 capacity in the church. That system seems to be working well and allows us to accommodate our usual numbers while maintaining social distancing. A big thank you goes to our ushers who have generously helped out with assisting in both buildings to assure safety and hospitality.
